ACT ONE

FADE IN:

INT. APARTMENT - KITCHEN - EVENING

The family is eating dinner. Linda enters with a bright green jacket.

LINDA

Lookie, lookie, my green blazer from when I had jury duty on St. Patrick's Day.

BOB

What's the blazer for?

LINDA

Tina's gonna wear it at her audition tomorrow for the school news channel.

TTNA

(PUTS BLAZER ON) I want to be a serious newswoman, like Holly Hunter in Broadcast News. "It must be great being right all the time. No, it's terrible."

LINDA

Aw.

TINA

I need to practice being a television journalist. Dad, can I interview you?

Um, okay.

Louise "aims" a sideways water glass at Bob as if a lens.

LOUISE

Don't look directly into the

camera, Dad.

BOB

I got it.

TINA

(TO BOB, SPOON AS MIC) So tell me,

why burgers?

BOB

Well, my dad got me started--

TINA

Do you see this as a stepping stone

to a real restaurant?

BOB

It is a real restaurant.

LOUISE

Mm, slop shop.

TINA

Can you cook anything other than

burgers?

BOB

Yes, lots of things.

TINA

Like...?

BOB

Like... um... like paella.

TINA

Paella. Tell me how you make that.

BOB

Well, I'd have to look up the

recipe, but uh...

TINA

So you don't know how to make paella.

BOB

No, I could eh... make--

TINA

Okay, I'm confused...

BOB

(SIGH)

TINA

...Because a minute ago you were an expert.

GENE

Dad needs media coaching!

BOB

Look, I randomly said paella! I didn't mean to.

LOUISE

(RE: "CAMERA") Ahh, I'm going in tight.

LINDA

(SOTTO) Bob, get off paella!

BOB

All right, interview's over! Get that camera out of my face!

Bob blocks Louise's "camera" with his hands.

LOUISE

I think we got what we need.

EXT. BOB'S BURGERS - ESTABLISHING - NEXT MORNING

INT. BOB'S BURGERS - DINING ROOM - CONTINUOUS

Tina is in the green blazer, as she and the other kids head off for school.

LINDA

You look amazing, sweetie. And you're gonna look even better on camera. You inherited my strong chin.

TINA

Where's your strong chin, Mom? I can't see it.

LINDA

Keep looking, you'll find it.

LOUISE

What did I inherit from you, Mom?

LINDA

You got my zest for life and my extra long pinky toe.

GENE

And I got your birthing hips!

LINDA

Actually, Gene, you take more after your father.

GENE

No! Hips don't lie!

LINDA

Look at this.

Linda gets an old photo of Bob from the register and shows Gene.

GENE

I forgot that I went through a Judd Nelson phase!

ANGLE ON: The photo of Bob when he was younger.

LINDA

That's your father! When he was your age he looked just like you.

GENE

Ugh. Wait. Does that mean when I'm his age I'm gonna look just like him?

Louise pulls Bob close.

LOUISE

Spoiler alert!

GENE

(MORTIFIED) No!

BOB

Hey. You could do worse.

GENE

I don't see how.

TINA

At least you know your shoulders

won't go bald.

Louise meanwhile has slipped behind Gene and slyly cuts off a small chunk of his hair with scissors.

LOUISE

Gene, it's starting! I found this

on your pillow!

GENE

(FEELING SPOT) Ah! Oh, my God!

Quick, comb me over. Trump me!

BOB

Louise.

LOUISE

What?

LINDA

You're not going bald, Gene.

Apologize, Louise.

LOUISE

Sorry. (SNIPS ANOTHER LOCK) Sorry.

(SNIPS) Sorry. (SNIPS)

GENE

It's OK. What's the point of clinging to this, if (RE: BOB) I'm doomed to be that?

LINDA

Huh. I don't know.

BOB

Lin.

GENE

Why wait? Let's do it now. I want the Whole Bob. Male pattern baldness.

BOB

Hmm.

GENE

Stoop shoulders.

BOB

Stop.

GENE

Paunch.

BOB

Please.

GENE

And the push broom on my lip.

BOB

This is incredibly insulting.

GENE

Think about how I feel. You really let myself go.

BOB

Go to school.

LOUISE

We're going!

TINA

Bye!

Tina and Gene follow Louise out the door.

EXT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - ESTABLISHING - DAY

INT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - NEWS STUDIO - CONTINUOUS

An impressive studio with cameras, computers, mixers, etc. MR. GRANT (mid 30s, high energy) addresses the students who are gathered for the auditions.

MR. GRANT

Remember kids, this is just the student news. No pressure. I'll only be going back frame-by-frame and critiquing you on eye contact, presentation, and how cool you are. (TO NERDY KID) You really wanna do this?

KID

Oh.

The Kid leaves.

MR. GRANT

(RE: CLIPBOARD) Okay, first up to the green screen, Zeke, with sports.

ZEKE

Comin' at ya, Mr. Grant!

ZEKE walks up to the green screen.

ON MONITOR - MOMENTS LATER

Zeke appears as if he's reporting from a basketball court.

ZEKE

That game was tighter than a 'tater in a tail pipe! It was like two babies climbing on the same boob!

Then we lost.

ANGLE ON: Mr. Grant.

MR. GRANT

Wow, Zeke, I feel like I was there.

(THEN) Next up, auditioning for

field reporters: Andy and Ollie.

ON MONITOR - MOMENTS LATER

ANDY and OLLIE's green screen B.G. is of Vietnam war footage.

OLLIE

Back to you, Andy!

ANDY

Back to you, Ollie!

OLLIE

Back to you, Andy!

ANDY

And... back to you, Ollie!

ANGLE ON: Mr. Grant.

MR. GRANT

If only you two were Siamese twins.

ANDY

We can do that.

MR. GRANT

Oh, great.

ANDY/OLLIE (SIMULTANEOUS)

(SWOOSHING TOGETHER SOUNDS)

MR. GRANT (SIMULTANEOUS)

That'd be super helpful if you could figure that out. It looks like it's working.

OLLIE

Push.

ANDY

We did it!

MR. GRANT

So sweet. And next up, for the coveted anchor spot, Tammy.

TINA

Good luck, Tammy.

TAMMY

Ah, I was born lucky, Tina. 'Cause I was born me and not you.

(MORE)

TAMMY (CONT'D)

And I'm a blonde now, so I'm better

than you. (LAUGHS, BLOWS PAST TINA)

TINA

I don't like what you say but I admire the way you say it.

ON MONITOR - MOMENTS LATER

TAMMY's green screen B.G. is the White House.

TAMMY

Whoa! It's Tammy with the news!

Woo! Neeeeeew-woo-wos! News!

ANGLE ON: Mr. Grant.

MR. GRANT

Tam, slam, thank you, ma'am! Next

up: Tina.

Tammy crosses to Tina.

TAMMY

Oh, hey, Tina. Little tip: you're a super fast talker. So talk really slow.

TINA

Thanks, Tammy.

TAMMY

Whoa! (QUICK CHUCKLE) That's still way too fast!

Tina dons the green blazer and steps in front of the green screen.

TINA

Mr. Grant, I'm here because I have

a nose for news.

MR. GRANT

Great. Now, about that green

jacket...

TINA

I'm Tina with--

TAMMY

(WHISPERS) Tina! (MAKES THE

"STRETCH" GESTURE)

TTNA

The-- With... the...

Because of the green jacket, on the monitor all we see is Tina's disembodied head in front of the White House.

TINA (CONT'D)

Neeews...

OLLIE (SIMULTANEOUS WITH TINA)

(SCREAMS)

ANDY (SIMULTANEOUS WITH TINA)

Paranormal activity!

MR. GRANT

Ah!

INT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - HALL - BULLETIN BOARD

Mr. Grant pins up the Wagstaff School News assignments posting. Kids crowd around, looking for their names.

TAMMY

Ohmigod, I'm anchor! Yes! Yes!

Yeah! Yeah! Yeah! Yea-ya-woo!

I am anchor!

Kids find their names, or don't, and peel off. Only Tina is left. At the bottom of the list she finds her name next to:

TINA

I'm... "staff intern?" But I
already had a sign-off. "Goodbye
audience."

MR. GRANT

Well, maybe you could change it to

"Does anyone need juice?"

TINA

"Does anyone need juice?"

MR. GRANT

Hmm. Maybe it will work better when you have some juice.

Mr. Grant walks off.

FADE OUT.

13.

END OF ACT ONE

ACT TWO

FADE IN:

EXT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - ESTABLISHING - MOMENTS LATER

INT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - HALL - CONTINUOUS

Tina follows Mr. Grant down the hall.

TINA

So what does the staff intern do?

MR. GRANT

Besides go on juice box runs?

TINA

Yeah.

MR. GRANT

Oh, lots of things. You know? Hand out the juice. Make sure people are happy with their juice.

TINA

Mm-hmm.

MR. GRANT

Clean up all the empty juice

boxes...

TINA

Okay. Isn't there any other important behind-the-scenes stuff I could do to help?

They enter the news studio.

INT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - NEWS STUDIO - CONTINUOUS

MR. GRANT

Well, there's editing, music, effects. That stuff is a blast!

TINA

Great.

MR. GRANT

But I do those. (CHUCKLES) I mean, if you did them, what would I do?

TINA

Be the teacher?

MR. GRANT

(CHUCKLING) Yeah, right, Tina, that sounds great. I'll just teach. Ugh.

EXT. APARTMENT - ESTABLISHING - MORNING

INT. APARTMENT - BATHROOM - CONTINUOUS

Louise cuts Gene's hair, daubs glue on his body, and sprinkles the trimmings on him like pepper.

LOUISE

...A little more off the top,
sprinkle on the back, in the ears,
a little more glue... Buh, buh,
buh, buh...

GENE

Show me, show me!

LOUISE

Voila!

Gene stands up and looks in the mirror. We now see Gene in his Little Bob glory -- 'stache, baldness, body hair. It's uncanny. Louise gives him a hand mirror, like at the barber shop.

GENE

It's perfect! I've been tarred and Bobbed.

LOUISE

I don't know how I got that arm hair to look so sad, but I did it.

Bob enters.

BOB

Can I get in here? I need to-- oh my God!

GENE

(RE: BOB) It's like looking in a mirror.

BOB

No, it isn't, Gene.

GENE

Who's Gene?

LOUISE

I already can't tell who's who.

BOB

Take that stuff off.

GENE

Lin, get in here and settle this!

BOB

Don't call your mother "Lin."

Linda enters.

LINDA

Wha? Oh, wha... ha-hey! Wow, travel

size Bob! Aw!

BOB

Linda! You're encouraging him.

Tina enters.

TINA

I need the bathroom. (NOTICING) Oh, wow, this is confusing.

BOB

No, it's not!

GENE

(AS BOB) You're my family... and I

love you... but you're terrible...

you're all terrible.

BOB

I don't say that.

LOUISE (SIMULTANEOUS)

No, that's all you say.

LINDA (SIMULTANEOUS)

You do.

TINA (SIMULTANEOUS)

You kind of do.

BOB GENE

Unbelievable.

Unbelievable.

BOB

Gene.

GENE

Bob.

BOB

All right, enough.

GENE

Enough.

BOB

All right, I'm not doing this.

GENE

Yes you are.

BOB

No, I-- oh my god.

GENE

Oh god.

LINDA

He's really good. He's good.

GENE

Oh.

BOB

He's not good, Lin.

GENE

He's not good, Lin.

LINDA

He's good...

GENE

I don't know...

BOB

Gene!

GENE

What? Bob?

LINDA

...just like his mother. He's a

natural performer.

BOB

Lin!

GENE

Lin!

LINDA

What?

BOB

Gene!

GENE

Lin!

BOB

LIN!

GENE

GENE!

BOB

I'm leaving!

LINDA

Aw, he's so cute.

Bob and Gene walk into the hall.

INT. APARTMENT - HALL - CONTINUOUS

BOB

(TO GENE) Stop following me.

GENE

(TO BOB) Stop following me in front.

INT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - HALL - DAY

Tina walks down the hall with an assortment of juice boxes. The custodian, MR. BRANCA, is mopping up a coned-off area.

TINA

Hi, Mr. Branca.

MR. BRANCA

Careful, Tina. Slippery!

TINA

(GASP) Did Mrs. Persky's water break? I may have won the baby

pool.

MR. BRANCA

Worse. Someone dragged in a dog turd! And this isn't the first time either.

TINA

You have great stories, Mr. Branca.

MR. BRANCA

I ever tell you, you're like my best friend.

TINA

Oh, thank you.

INT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - OUTSIDE THE NEWS STUDIO - MOMENTS LATER

MR. GRANT (O.S.)

Look, this news show...

INT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - NEWS STUDIO - CONTINUOUS

Mr. Grant talks to his news team.

MR. GRANT

...competes for students' attention with cell phones, gossip and bathroom graffiti. We need to be faster, meaner and graffitier. So, what I'm--

Tina enters with the juice boxes.

TINA

I have a cran-apple, two grapes, and a bunch of kiwi-strawberry.

Here's the crazy straw you asked for, Zeke. Extra crazy, just how you like it.

ZEKE

(SUCKS ON IT) Could be crazier.

MR. GRANT

Now who knows the five W's of school news?

TINA

Oh! Who, what, where, when, and sometimes why. Or is that vowels?

MR. GRANT

No! They're wow! Woo-hoo! Way hot! Weird! And what-the-mu--?! Every story we do should have all five.

ZEKE

I got one. New kid nip slips!

MR. GRANT

Way hot, Zeke!

TAMMY

Oh! Who's parents are poor?

MR. GRANT

Woo-hoo, Tammy!

TINA

I've got one. The custodian says someone is tracking in dog poo.

What-the-wuh--?!

MR. GRANT

(EYE ROLL) Less caca, more Gaga,

Tina. Anyone else?

TAMMY

I hear there's a 45-year-old fourth grader with a mustache walking around school.

MR. GRANT

Now that's pretty what-the-uhh--?!
Go with that!

Tina, defeated, drops her head.

ON TV: WAGSTAFF SCHOOL NEWS - BROADCAST

A pounding electronic score and high-end graphics. "WSN Wagstaff School News" blazes on the screen.

ZEKE (V.O.)

This is WSN. The news you need...

from the students you like... in

your face!

WSN then EXPLODES, for no reason, like the Death Star. We CUT to Tammy standing in an ESPN-like virtual news room.

TAMMY

I'm Tammy Larson and these are the breaking stories. What's up with Brenda? I mean, right?

A picture of BRENDA appears in a box over Tammy's shoulder.

TAMMY (CONT'D)

Jimmy Pesto Junior previews dance moves the principal won't allow at winter prom...

INSERT VIDEO OF JIMMY JUNIOR DANCING:

JIMMY JUNIOR (ON MONITOR)

(PELVIC THRUST) This one's out.

(BUTT SLAP) Can't do this. (CROTCH

RUB) Forget about this one! Ugh!

ANGLE ON: Tina, watching from behind the news camera.

TINA

(TO HERSELF) I love it, but it's not news.

BACK ON: Tammy. The over-the-shoulder box reads "LENNY WATCH".

TAMMY

Now to our top story, Lenny

Destefano -- is there enough of him
to go around? And how can we ration
our passion?

Tammy turns to JOCELYN.

TAMMY (CONT'D)

Jocelyn, who's Lenny going to the winter prom with?

JOCELYN

No one knows. He's going out with Julie, but he's been texting the entire drill team. And me.

TAMMY

And me also.

JOCELYN (O.S.)

(COOL) Oh?

TAMMY

Now to Zeke with dodgeball highlights.

ZEKE

Thanks, Tammy.

INSERT VIDEO OF KIDS GETTING HIT IN THE BALLS:

ZEKE (TV V.O.) (CONT'D)

25.

Here's a kid getting it in the muchachos. Ooh! Here's another dude -- right in the Easter eggs.

Booliing! Watch this geezer with a 'stache get his.

WE SEE Gene groan as he takes a kickball to the groin.

GENE (ON TV)

Ugh! It's okay, I've had my kids.

INT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - HALL - LATER

Tina, dejected, passes Mr. Branca, with cleaning supplies.

MR. BRANCA

Hey, Tina, I saw the news. Is that true about Lenny and the drill team? (SHAKES HEAD) Julie deserves better.

TINA

This school deserves better news.

MR. BRANCA

Well, I just got back from the library. More shoe poopy got dragged in up there— all the way to the reference section.

TINA

Talk about Encyclopedia Brown.

MR. BRANCA

(TOO LOUDLY) Ha-ha! Eih! I don't get it.

TINA

Wait... That's a pretty long way to track something in on a shoe. I'm going to poke around. Something doesn't smell right.

MR. BRANCA

(RE: MOP BUCKET) That's this.

TINA

Oh, yeah.

EXT. BOB'S BURGERS - ESTABLISHING - DAY

TEDDY

So it is apple sauce...

INT. BOB'S BURGERS - DINING ROOM - CONTINUOUS

TEDDY is talking to Bob as Linda wipes the counter.

TEDDY

...but try to find it in the sauce aisle at the supermarket, you'll be sorely disappointed. Anyway, I was looking for chutney...

BOB

Uh, is this a long story, Teddy? I mean, it has been long, but is it longer?

TEDDY

I haven't gotten to the story part yet.

BOB

Gene, I need you behind the counter.

Gene enters from the kitchen.

BOB (CONT'D)

Just stand here, and I'll be right back. (HEADS TO KITCHEN)

TEDDY

I'm not sure I appreciate being foisted off like this, Bob!

Gene strikes a listening pose.

TEDDY (CONT'D)

(THEN, TO GENE) So anyway, I end up in the ethnic food section-

GENE

Mmm-hmm.

TEDDY

-and it was like a whole new world opened up.

GENE

Mmm-hmm.

I bought baby food from India.

Those babies are tough. No joke on those spices.

GENE

That's fascinating, Teddy.

TEDDY

(TO LINDA) Little Bob is great.

LINDA

(RIBBING) Yeah, I guess I'll keep

him. Ha ha!

GENE

Lin, stop.

LINDA

You stop.

GENE

No, stop Lin.

LINDA

No, you stop little Bobby.

GENE

Mmm-hmm. Stop.

LINDA

Bobby, stop.

TEDDY

Look at you two! You're like an old married couple.

GENE

We put up with each other.

BOB

(FROM THE PASS-THROUGH) All right, enough. Gene, get back to the kitchen.

ANGLE ON: Tina and Louise at a booth, bussing a table.

TTNA

How could dog poop make it all the way up two flights of stairs and into the library on a shoe without being wiped off?

LOUISE

Tele-pooptation.

TINA

Let's experiment. We need something the exact same size and texture as poop.

LOUISE

How 'bout Dad's burger? It's even the same color!

Louise holds up a half eaten burger on a plate.

TTNA

Great idea.

Tina dumps the burger on the floor and she and Louise walk through it and around the restaurant.

TINA (SIMULTANEOUS) (CONT'D)

(FART NOISES)

LOUISE (SIMULTANEOUS)

(FART NOISES)

Linda notices.

LINDA

What the hell are you kids doing?

LOUISE

Walking on one of Dad's burgers to see how much like dog-doo it is.

LINDA

Oh, science!

Tina checks her shoe.

TINA

It's clean. That can mean only one thing. The poos must have come from inside the school.

LOUISE

Which means... they're probably human!

TINA

I knew there was a story there.

We're looking at a serial pooper!

STING! CU of Tina. CU of Louise.

LINDA

Oh my God!

TINA

Is it you, Louise?

I have dabbled in the area, but I don't get enough food to be a serial pooper. I, uh, probably only poop once a week.

TINA

I think I'll call the culprit the Mad Pooper.

LINDA

Ooh, I got a better one, the Buttler. Get it?

LOUISE

I get it. It's got butt in it.

LINDA

Ha ha! Pfft pfft. Butt.

TINA

(DETERMINED) Whatever we call him, or her, it's definitely news.

INT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - OUTSIDE THE NEWS STUDIO - DAY

MR. GRANT (O.S.)

That's toilet journalism, Tina.

INT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - NEWS STUDIO - CONTINUOUS

Mr. Grant and Tammy stand by a peg board. Tina is mid-plea with Mr. Grant.

MR. GRANT

We do gutter journalism.

TINA

But there's a Mad Pooper loose in the school! It's the job of the news to inform the public! It's worth it even if we save just one shoe!

TAMMY

Yuck.

MR. GRANT

Well said, Tammy.

INT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - HALL - MOMENTS LATER

Tina's outside the newsroom with Louise.

TINA

Ugh, the Mad Pooper story is ten times bigger than Lenny Destefano's love life.

LOUISE

And less disgusting. He'll put his lips on anything with pom poms.

TINA

But I can't get it out there. WSN has a news monopoly!

LOUISE

So do your own newscast.

TINA

My own newscast? You think I could do that?

Who's the one yammering about her

nose for news?!

TINA

Me?

LOUISE

Yeah, this nose right here-- (GRABS

TINA'S NOSE) Gah!

TINA

Ow! Ow.

LOUISE

Get it sniffing! Snort some news up

there!

TINA

(THROUGH SQUEEZED NOSE) I can't

snort 'cause you're holding my

nose.

LOUISE

There's gonna be lots of things

holding you back!

TINA

Okay.

LOUISE

Snort it up!

TINA (SIMULTANEOUS)

(SNORTS)

LOUISE (SIMULTANEOUS)

Come on, Cronkite, snort! It's for the good of the people! Lemme know when you got something!

Suddenly a scream O.S. Louise lets go of Tina's nose.

DIORAMA GIRL (O.S.)

(SCREAM)

They turn. ANGLE ON: A classroom door.

INT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - CLASSROOM - CONTINUOUS

They poke their heads in to see a GIRL looking at her diorama.

DIORAMA GIRL

My diorama! It got diarrheaed!

TINA

I think I just snorted a story.

FADE OUT.

END OF ACT TWO

ACT THREE

35.

FADE IN:

INT. APARTMENT - HALLWAY CLOSET - LATER

Tina watches Louise fill a box with stuff from the closet.

TINA

Dad's old camcorder, a VCR, and a videotape?

LOUISE

Say hello to your state-of-the-art studio.

TINA

(READS VIDEOTAPE) But this is Gene's birth.

LOUISE

There's a lot of crowning stuff
that can just be taped over. It
looks like an angry softball trying
to get out of a coin purse.

Gene crosses through.

GENE

Bob enters and observes Gene's pep talk.

Hm, mm-kay. (TO TINA) Listen, princess. I don't even know what you're talking about but you can do anything you set your mind to. And no matter what, your mother and I will always love you. (KISS SOUND)

TINA

He's good.

LOUISE

That kid just fathered the crap out of you.

BOB

(BEGRUDGING) He did okay.

Gene exits.

GENE

I did great.

BOB

A little preachy.

INT. WAGSTAFF PUBLIC SCHOOL - HALL - DAY

Tina is in her green blazer. Louise "powders" her with a blackboard eraser.

LOUISE

You gotta lot of shine on you, Tina.

TINA

(COUGHS ON DUST) How did you get equal time on the school network?

LOUISE

I told Principal Spoors I had incriminating pictures of him.

Because I drew some incriminating pictures of him.

TTNA

Great! Let's do this.

ON TV: TINA NEWS NETWORK - BROADCAST

In contrast to WSN, Tina News looks like crap. '90s-vintage video captioning spells out titles that Tina reads (while Louise adds cliched newsroom typing sounds).

TINA (O.S.) (SIMULTANEOUS)

Tina News Presents... Wagstaff Held

Hostage... by the Mad Pooper.

LOUISE (O.S.) (SIMULTANEOUS)

Clickety-clackety-clack... Type,

type, type... Clickety-clackety...

Type, type... Ding!... Clickety-

clackety...

We CUT to Tina slowly walking the Wagstaff halls.

TTNA

These halls are calm now. But on

Wednesday it was a different story.

INT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - CLASSROOM - SAME TIME

Kids are watching Tina's news.

DIORAMA GIRL (ON TV)

I left my shoebox diorama for a

minute. And someone pooped in it!

It was about the Industrial

Revolution! (SOBS)

BACK TO THE FEED:

Tina stands by a map of Wagstaff with brown thumbtacks in it.

TTNA

Some call him the Mad Pooper. My mom calls him the Butt-ler. By any name, these brown thumbtacks tell a tale of terror.

INT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - CLASSROOM - SAME TIME

The TEACHER watches the broadcast, riveted. A STUDENT walks up. $\,$

STUDENT

'Scuse me, could I go get my medicine at the nurse's office?

TEACHER

Shush! I'm watching this!

STUDENT

Ohh... oh no.

BACK TO THE FEED:

TINA

Who would do such a thing? We turned to an expert, Mr. Frond.

INSERT: MR. FROND interview.

MR. FROND

It's someone trying to communicate.

Likely a foreign exchange student.

He -- or she -- has something

inside them they desperately want

to get out.

TINA

Rage?

MR. FROND

Poo.

END INTERVIEW:

TINA

And what do Wagstaff students

think?

INSERT INTERVIEW VIDEO: GENE (AS LITTLE BOB)

GENE

My message to the Mad Pooper is grow up! I did.

INT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - CLASSROOM - SAME TIME

TINA (ON TV)

Whoever the Mad Pooper is, he or she is probably not finished... And if they're not, I'm not. "In the hall, I'm Tina Belcher."

The camera shakes.

LOUISE (ON TV, O.S.)

And we're clear.

TINA (ON TV)

(PUMPS FIST) Yes! I did it! Take that, Tammy. And Holly Hunter.

ANGLE ON: Tammy is shocked. The class watches Tina's broadcast.

LOUISE (ON TV, O.S.)

I lied. We're not clear.

The camera angles on Tina's feet.

LOUISE (ON TV, O.S.) (CONT'D)

Okay, now we're clear. I'll just

edit that part out.

TINA (ON TV)

(WALKS OFF) Oh, okay, good.

Tina's broadcast ends.

MONTAGE:

- On camera, surrounded by caution tape, Tina points to the floor... (CHYRON: "SCHOOL GETS NEW STOOLS") on the side of an aquarium... (CHYRON: "MAD POOPER DOES A SOLID") around a vacant slot of a candy machine... (CHYRON: "MAD POOPER: #1 AT #2'S) a sign reads, "CAUTION HAZARDOUS WASTE".
- School kids watch the TV.
- Bob and Gene are side by side at the bathroom sink. Bob is shaving. Gene is shaving his bald spot. Bob glares at Gene.
- A LUNCH LADY lifts the lid of a pot, recoils with horror. CUT TO: A brown thumbtack is placed in the map.
- School kids watch the TV.
- Bob plucks a nose hair out. Gene picks it up and puts it in his nose.
- During band practice, a TROMBONE PLAYERS's cheeks pop out like Dizzy Gillespie. With a BLAAP, what was blocking the trumpet is dislodged and knocks over a music stand. The kid's eyes widen. CUT TO: Tina putting in another thumbtack. Tina pushes her glasses up.

MATCH CUT TO:

INT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - NEWS STUDIO

Tina's report is paused on the monitor. Mr. Grant faces his news staff.

MR. GRANT

Ahh dammit, we got poop scooped! Tina's story is all anyone's talking about! Tammy, what happened?

TAMMY

Well you said Gaga, not caca!

MR. GRANT

This caca is Gaga! Now get me that story.

TAMMY

I don't know how!

MR. GRANT

Do it or I'll replace you with the weird twins!

OLLIE (SIMULTANEOUS)

Back to you, Andy! Back to you, Andy.

ANDY (SIMULTANEOUS)

Back to you, Ollie! Back to you, Ollie.

MR. GRANT

No, okay, no no no no no no no no! Forget it.

INT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - HALL - LATER

Tina walks by some lockers. Tammy approaches.

Hey, Tina. Great Mad Pooper reporting!

TINA

Thanks.

TAMMY

Can I copy you? Like I do in math class?

TINA

Real news isn't about copying. And you shouldn't copy me in math.

TAMMY

Yeah, well you should get a tutor, cause I got a C.

TINA

You got a C? Wait, I got a D.

TAMMY

You know what? I'll do my own story. And it'll be way better than yours, you lame-pon.

TINA

Good, I hope it is!

TAMMY

It will be! (WALKS AWAY)

TINA

Because then we'll have more information about the Mad Pooper. TAMMY

(POPS IN) Tina, we're trashtalking. Stop turning it into a normal conversation! (WALKS AWAY)

TINA

Oh, sorry. Um, skank?

TAMMY

(POPS IN) That's much better!

(WALKS AWAY)

TINA

Uh, I hate your new hair color?

TAMMY

(POPS IN) Give it to me!

TINA

Your eyeshadow is a little... much.

TAMMY (O.S.)

In the face! My face.

HARD CUT TO:

43.

ON TV: WAGSTAFF SCHOOL NEWS - BROADCAST

The screen reads: "BREAKING NEWS".

The image over Tammy's shoulder reads, "POOP SCOOP" with a picture of Tina in the middle.

TAMMY

Our top story: Is Tina the Mad
Pooper? What if actual surveillance
footage existed showing Tina in the
act? Let's go to a reenactment of
what that footage might look like.

INSERT GRAINY FOOTAGE:

Tammy, wearing a wig, "Tina" glasses and a green jacket, skulks through the library surreptitiously. She looks around and then sits down out of frame. FART noise.

INTERVIEW WITH ANDY AND OLLIE:

The twins are captioned: "ANDY AND OLLIE PESTO - TINA'S NEIGHBORS".

OLLIE

She was always so quiet!

ANDY

Yeah, she kept to herself!

OLLIE

Yeah, she did.

ANDY

She did.

BACK TO TAMMY:

TAMMY

So did Tina create the very story she reported on? Mr. Grant is here to comment.

MR. GRANT

When Tina auditioned, frankly I was physically afraid of her ambition. She would've done anything to get on TV. And now, apparently, she has.

TAMMY

Ahh, and what if WSN had an exclusive video confession?

INSERT CRUDELY-EDITED VIDEO FROM TINA'S NEWS:

TINA

Me... Tina... are... Mad Pooper.

WIDEN to reveal...

INT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - TINA'S CLASS - CONTINUOUS

... Tina's class watching this. They all turn to look at her.

TINA

You don't believe that just because

it was on TV, right?

MISS JACOBSON is on the phone at her desk.

MISS JACOBSON

(LISTENS) Got it. (HANGS UP, THEN)

Tina, principal's office. Now!

STING! CU of Tina.

INT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - HALLWAY - MOMENTS LATER

Students and teachers watch as Miss Jacobson leads Tina in her "perp walk." Other kids snap photos with their camera phones. Kids gasp.

TINA

I didn't do it. Follow the money.

I'll take a poop detector test!

As Tina passes, we see the accusing, jeering faces of students and teachers, and Mr. Branca, with mop and bucket, who glares as she passes.

MR. BRANCA

Poop on me once, shame on you. Poop on me twice, we're not best friends anymore!

FADE OUT.

END OF ACT THREE

ACT FOUR

FADE IN:

EXT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - ESTABLISHING - DAY

INT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - PRINCIPAL'S OFFICE SUITE - CONTINUOUS

Tina sits outside a closed door. A secretary, MS. SCHNUR, types.

TTNA

It's not me! It was a re-enactment!

MS. SCHNUR

If it didn't happen then how could they re-enact it?

TINA

Huh, oh yeah.

Louise enters.

LOUISE

Oh, you should be a teacher instead of a secretary, Ms. Schnur.

MS. SCHNUR

T know.

TINA

Louise, why are you here? Tammy didn't frame you.

LOUISE

Unrelated charge.

EXT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - OUTSIDE MR. FROND'S OFFICE - FLASHBACK

INT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - MR. FROND'S OFFICE - CONTINUOUS

Louise (wearing a Hannibal Lecter mask) squeezes into a large drawer in Mr. Frond's desk and manages to close the drawer.

LOUISE

And now we wait.

BACK TO SCENE:

TINA

At least you're guilty of something. I got framed!

MS. SCHNUR

Cry to Principal Spoors when he gets back from the anti-smoking assembly.

TINA

(GASPS, TO LOUISE) Ohmigod, the assembly. The whole school is there. Can you think of a better place for the Mad Pooper to strike?

LOUISE

The Super Bowl. American Idol.

Westminster Dog Show. Upside down
roller coaster. International Space
Station. Yoga retreat. Inside a tshirt gun--

TINA

If I could only get out of here I could clear my name.

ANGLE ON: Ms. Schnur.

LOUISE

I'll take care of Ms. Schnur.

Louise stands on her chair and looks out the window.

LOUISE (CONT'D)

(ACTING) Oh no, look, they're

towing a... high-mileage smallish

car... with a... bumpersticker

about a personal passion maybe...?

MS. SCHNUR

"My other car is a cat"?

LOUISE

That's the one!

MS. SCHNUR

Ohh!

Ms. Schnur races out.

TINA

I hope Ms. Schnur's car is okay.

LOUISE

Go, Tina!

TINA

Oh yeah.

Tina bolts from the office.

INT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - HALL - CONTINUOUS

Tina sprints down the hall, past a poster advertising the "Stick-y Situations Devil Stick Anti-Smoking Assembly."

INT. PRINCIPAL'S OFFICE SUITE - MOMENTS LATER

Gene enters.

GENE

All right, missy, this better be good! (THEN) Louise, where's your sister?

LOUISE

Tina's not here, Gene.

GENE

Don't you sass me!

LOUISE

Hey, I don't even let Dad talk to me like that.

Bob and Linda rush in.

BOB

(BREATHING HEAVY) We got here as soon as we could -- Gene, what are you doing here?

GENE

They called me!

BOB

No, they called me!

LINDA

I can't believe my daughter is the Butt-ler.

GENE

I have no daughter!

LINDA

Oh, don't say that, Gene!

BOB

Yes, he should say that!

LOUISE

C'mon, she's down at the assembly,

trying to clear her name.

Louise exits.

GENE

(SIGHS) Our lives were so much

simpler before the rugrats.

Gene exits.

LINDA

We used to see movies.

BOB

Lin!

LINDA

Sorry! But it's true.

Bob and Linda follow the kids.

INT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - GYMNASIUM - MOMENTS LATER

Tina slips into the gym. Kids fill the seats and spill out onto the floor. Devil stick jugglers are doing their thing. (A troupe member uses a sideline camera on a tripod, which projects their images on a big portable TV screen.)

JUGGLER #1

(JUGGLING) Cigarettes are the real

devil sticks!... Nicotine is a bad

scene!

Tina scans the room: bored kids, anti-smoking signage, devilsticking.

TTNA

(SOTTO) You're here somewhere, Mad

Pooper...

She moves through the crowd.

ANGLE ON: Bob, Linda, Gene and Louise entering the gym.

LINDA

Let's stay focused. We gotta find

Tin-- ooh, jugglers!

A juggler sticks a devil stick in his mouth.

JUGGLER #1

Hey, can I get a light?

JUGGLER #2

Sure! Smoke 'em if you got 'em!

With a huge prop Bic lighter he lights the devil stick.

BOB

This is kind of a weird message.

LINDA

I really want a cigarette.

BOB

I really want to juggle.

Louise watches as Tina enters the back stage area. She moves off from the family.

ON TINA as she continues to scan the crowd like a Secret Service agent. All is normal. Louise, who has separated from the rest of the family, finds her.

LOUISE

No sign?

TINA

Nothing.

Tina looks UP, straight over her head, and sees a shadowy CROUCHING FIGURE in the scaffolding.

TINA (CONT'D)

Oh my God, look -- the Pooper!

Tina turns back to Louise.

TINA (CONT'D)

I need to get up there, but how?

LOUISE

You could use that hydraulic

scissor lift.

Louise points to a hydraulic scissor lift.

TINA

Perfect, I'll sneak up on him. I'll

be as quiet as a mouse.

INT. WAGSTAFF SCHOOL - AUDITORIUM - MOMENTS LATER

ANGLE ON: Tammy and Mr. Grant watching the assembly.

MR. GRANT

Kelly Mathis and Jocelyn are

wearing the same scrunchie. But

Jocelyn is definitely wearing it

better.

BEEP! BEEP! ANGLE ON: Tina drives the loud scissor lift on stage. She raises the lift, nearing the scaffolding.

TAMMY

Mr. Grant, look, it's Tina! What's

she doing up there?

MR. GRANT

Maybe she is the Mad Pooper... Hey,

we're better than we thought! Let's

get that camera!

TAMMY

Yeah, catch her in the act!

MR. GRANT

On the big screen!

TAMMY

That's a big load of news!

Mr. Grant grabs the camera and trains it on Tina.

TAMMY (CONT'D)

Look, everyone! It's the Mad

Pooper!

Tina's image is on the big screen, climbing from the lift onto the scaffolding. The crowd reacts.

LENNY

(GIRLISH SCREAM)

Lenny grabs Julie's notebook and puts it over his head.

LINDA

Oh! It's Tina!

BOB

Tina! What are you doing?! Get

down!

Everyone watches Tina, spellbound. The scaffolding gives way a little, she holds on; the crowd gasps.

LINDA

Oh my god!

TINA

Come out of the shadows, Mad Pooper!

The figure moves into the light -- it's...

The crowd reacts, shocked and confused.

TINA (CONT'D)

Zeke?

#2ASA21

ZEKE

Surprised?

LINDA

(GASP) Zeke's the Butt-ler!

ANGLE ON: Tina and Zeke. Tina stands.

TINA

Why'd you do it, Zeke?

ZEKE

Well, the first time was an accident, but the second time was for fun. Then accident, fun, fun, another accident, three funs in a row, then after that, I was doing it for you, Tina.

TINA

Aw.

LINDA

Aw.

TINA

But now it's over.

ZEKE

It's not over! I got one left!

TINA

Zeke, no!

As Zeke fumbles with his pants. The kids in the crowd chant:

LOUISE/KIDS

Poop! Poop! Poop!

ANGLE ON: Gene.

#2ASA21

GENE

Stupid kids! Listen to them! Poop's

not funny... I mean it is a little,

but what sort of message are we...

(BREAKS) Agghhh! I can't stand it!

I wanna see him poop! I wanna be a

kid again!

Gene rips off his mustache and body hair and joins in.

GENE (CONT'D)

Poop! Poop! Pooooooop!

BOB

Oh, thank God. He's back.

LINDA

Aw, I'll miss my Muppet Baby Bobby.

Tina reaches her hand out to Zeke.

TTNA

You don't have to do this...

KIDS/LOUISE

Poop! Poop! Poop! Poop! Poop!

Poop! Poop!

ZEKE

Here we go! Ahh, this isn't an

accident! No, it is, it is.

TIGHT ON: Zeke's face as he concentrates.

ZEKE (CONT'D)

Ah, ga- oh boy. (O.S.) Ay-ya-ya-ya-

ya... ay-ya-ya-ya-ya...

BOB

It's taking a long time.

ZEKE

It's a girl!... Huh! No, it's a

boy.

BOB

I guess we're really watching this.

LINDA

Bobby, hold my hand!

ZEKE

He's outta there!

TINA

Noooo!

ZEKE

Ahh.

LOUISE

Tammy, look out!

In SLO-MO: Louise shoves Tammy to a spot directly beneath Zeke -- in the line of fire. Louise smiles, her eyes following the poop.

TAMMY

(SLO-MO) Whoaaaa...

SMASH CUT TO:

57.

ON TV: WAGSTAFF SCHOOL NEWS - BROADCAST - THE NEXT DAY

TAMMY

Our top story, the Mad Pooper almost nails me! I'm joined by the girl who saved my hair. Louise, it was soooo close.

The camera widens to include a disappointed Louise.

LOUISE

I thought it was going to be a *lot* closer, Tammy, to be honest. But I miscalculated. Wind, maybe.

TAMMY

I was scared there was gonna be poop right into my mouth. Let's go to the Mad Pooper himself, Zeke, who incredibly is not in trouble. Let's find out why...

INSERT VIDEO OF ZEKE:

ZEKE

My family moves around a lot. BACK TO TAMMY, NOW JOINED BY MR. GRANT:

TAMMY

(NODDING, GRAVE) His family moves around a lot.

MR. GRANT

Uh, WSN would like to apologize for any inadvertent suggestion that

Tina Belcher was the Mad Pooper.

Our bad.

Over Mr. Grant's shoulder, a graphic of Tina appears. With a KA-CHUNK, her face is stamped "NOT GUILTY".

MR. GRANT (CONT'D)

And now a new WSN feature: the Tina Table.

The graphic changes to read, "THE TINA TABLE".

CUT TO: Tina wearing the green blazer, so her upper body vanishes again on the green screen background. She sits behind a Charlie Rose-style table. A graphic reads: "THE TINA TABLE".

TINA

Is it getting hot in here? One study shows the school nurse's thermometer is off by one degree. She's here to discuss it. (TURNS TO NEW CAMERA) Later, I'll talk to students about trading snacks at lunch. Is it insider trading? (THEN) No, it isn't.

ANGLE ON: Bob, Linda, Gene and Louise in the newsroom wings watching the broadcast on monitor.

LINDA

Look at my news girl, her pretty head floating like a balloon!

GENE

Is it just me or does Tina look great without a torso?

LOUISE

I wonder how'd she look with a mustache and a bald spot.

BOB

Huh, I just remembered how to make paella.

FADE TO BLACK.
