FADE IN:

1 EXT. ELYSIA - DAY

A ragtag band of hunters and trappers has set up camp against this beautiful backdrop. The scrawniest trapper in the bunch -- call him PYLENDOR -- is trying to drag the mule that is carrying his hides out of a mud puddle. The trapper has an audience of giggling CHILDREN as he tugs futilely on the rope around the mule's neck.

PYLENDOR

You're not getting any dinner if you don't get out of there right now...
Do you hear me, Bathsheba?... Move...

But the mule just digs its heels a little deeper in the mud and the children's giggling turns to outright laughter. It looks like a Grecian standoff until:

A MAN (0.S.) Instead of all that vinegar, you should try a little honey.

Pylendor turns and finds himself looking at an OLD HUNTER who has the air of a benevolent schoolmaster.

OLD HUNTER
And if you don't have any honey, a
carrot usually does the trick.

He takes a carrot from behind his back and offers it to the mule, who, naturally, walks right over and eats it out of his hand. The old hunter grins amiably at Pylendor.

OLD HUNTER Works every time, my friend.

But as he goes to slap Pylendor on the back

AN ARROW HITS THE OLD HUNTER IN THE HEART

and drives his instantly lifeless body back into the mud puddle with a sickening splat.

Pylendor's jaw drops in amazement, his terrified mule runs for parts unknown, the screaming children scatter every which way, and the rest of the villagers are looking up the mill toward the sound of blood-ourdling battle ories.

THEIR POV

Charging toward them on horseback is a band of 50 marauding WARRIORS, unwashed, unshaven and unencumbered by the need to prolong any lives except their own. The warriors thunder into the camp with a vengeance, leap from their horses and begin wiping out the men, dragging off the women and knocking down the children.

Only one of these heathen invaders stays on his horse, and that is as it should be. For he is DARPHUS, their leader, back from the dead to serve as Ares' killing machine.

DARPHUS

You!

He points at the petrified Pylendor with his sword.

PYLENDOR

Don't kill me. I'm just trying to get to Elysia.

DARPHUS

I beat you there.

(off Pylendor's look)

Now go find Hercules. Tell him that

Darphus rides again. And if he doubts
that it is me, say you saw the scar
that the traitorous bitch Xena left me
with.

Darphus tears open his tunic to reveal the mottled red slash on his chest. Pylendor recoils at its ugliness.

DARPHUS

What are you waiting for? Go!

Pylendor takes off running, weaving through the slaughter that would have included him if fate hadn't intervened.

CUT TO:

2 EXT. TAVERN GARDEN - DAY

A jug of wine, a bowl of stew -- and SALMONEUS prattlimadly to HERCULES and XENA about his latest scheme.

SALMONEUS

It'll be the first celebrity biography in history, and it'll be about you, Hercules. Come on, the public's begging for it.

(to Pylendor)
Coming with us?

SALMONEUS

Hey, no problem. (to Hercules and Xena) Is there?

When he sees the doubt and anxiety on their faces, you can almost hear his knees start to knock.

CUT TO:

3 EXT. ELYSIA - DAY

The tranquility in this prosperous village has been turned into a nightmare. Darphus and two of his myriad scowling warriors drive the point home as they drag a terrified VILLAGER through the bodies and rubble. Looming ahead of them is the village's temple.

VILLAGER
Why are you taking me to the temple?

Lock the others up takechat one to the Temple



No way he'll notice that they're going:

- -- Through a wooded area;
- -- Up a hillside;
- -- And along a ridgeline that leads them to:

7 EXT. CAMPSITE - DAY

Our intrepid travelers have set up camp beside a stream. Hercules and Xena watch in amusement as Salmoneus pulls a tablecloth out of his pack and spreads it on the ground with a flourish.

SALMONEUS
It doesn't really have an outdoorsy motif, but it'll do.

Then he digs back into his pack and comes up with three plates and three goblets. He breathes a sigh of relief.

SALMONEUS
I was worried they'd get broken.

HERCULES

(after a beat)

All right. I'll handle the cooking +

XENA

Guess that leaves the scouting to me.

call. He sounds like an owl with emphysema. But when he hears a rustling on the other side of a nearby tree, Salmoneus figures he has succeeded. He readies the burlap bag in which he's planning to capture his feathered quarry. Then he skulks toward the tree. The rustling is growing louder and louder. Salmoneus' heart is beating faster and faster. He's getting closer and closer until

A SHADOWY FIGURE LEAPS OUT OF THE TREE

and pounces on Salmoneus, who reacts with a startled squawk as the two of them go tumbling. When they finally come to a stop, the shadowy figure is straddling Salmoneus' chest, using his knees to pin the small-game hunter's arms to the ground. Salmoneus stares up at the shadowy figure, trying to cover bewilderment with bluster.

SALMONEUS

Enjoy yourself now, buster, because I'm a friend of Hercules; and when he finds out what you've done...

The shadowy figure -- all we've seen of him thus far is his back -- breaks into laughter that confounds Salmoneus.

SALMONEUS

What's so funny?

HIS POV

The shadowy figure turns out to be none other than IOLAUS, who has a quick answer for Salmoneus' question.

IOLAUS

You.

WIDE TO INCLUDE BOTH

SALMONEUS

I'm a lot funnier when I don't have someone using my chest for a chair. Now get off me or I really am going to

call Hercules.

ICLAUS

You act as though you actually know him.

SALMONEUS

Know him? I'm his official biographer.

Then we'll stop them both (Grins) it's good to bewith you again Herc.



And she charges them fearlessly, kicking, punching, swinging her terrible swift sword. She's like a thresher going through a field of grain, but there's nothing she can do about the fifth warrior.

Too far away to get swept up in the fray, he leaps on a horse and starts to gallop away. Only when Xena hears the sound of hoofbeats does she realize that he's escaping to carry word back to Darphus. But she still hasn't finished with the warriors she's fighting, so it's all she can do to get the bolo off her belt and hurl it at the rider.

She would hit him if it weren't for the tree he rides behind

an instant before the bolo gets there. The bolo snaps the tree in half, but the rider is safely off.

Now Xena is really angry. She turns back to the warriors she's fighting and wipes them out in a matter of seconds. Then she turns to stare at

11 EXT. DARPHUS' HEADQUARTERS - NIGHT - ESTABLISHING

Once this was the inn in Elysia. Now it's command central for the blood-thirsty Darphus.

DARPHUS (V.O.)

12 INT. DARPHUS' HEADQUARTERS - NIGHT

With his three most trusted LIEUTENANTS watching closely, Darphus is bestowing a cruel smile on QUINTUS, the warrior who escaped from Xena.

DARPHUS

(continuing)

...that I may spare your life, Quintus.

QUINTUS

But why would you think of killing me?

DARPHUS

You abandoned your comrades when they were fighting Xena.

QUINTUS

I had no choice. You needed to learn that Xena was near.

DARPHUS

Yes, and probably Hercules as well. The bastard son of Zeus and a traitorous harlot. But there is still the matter of loyalty...

In the distance, Graegus howls menapingly. Quintus strifens with fear. Darphus' eyes grow colder, harder.

(COMPINIE).

TO

HERCULES

The Dog of War is hungry. The more flesh and blood he consumes, the bigger he gets -- and the bigger he gets, the closer he is to helping Ares rule the world.

Life is full of surprises. (to Hercules)

Isn't it?

HERCULES

Yeah, it is. (a beat; to Iolaus) You know, there's something I've been meaning to tell you.

LOLAUS

Let me guess. We've got to play Rock, Dagger, Parchment for that last quail.

(CONTINUED)

Iolaus angrily crashes through the trees and bushes, not knowing where he is, not caring that he doesn't know. Behind him he can hear footsteps and:

HERCULES (O.S.) Iolaus?... Where are you, Iolaus?



IOLAUS


Is that what she says when the two of you are rolling around in bed?



(CONTINUED)

Darphus raising the bottle to his lips and drinking deeply as the overflow splashes onto his face and down his tunic. He's in high spirits, as are the lieutenants and warriors who are crowded in here with their own wine bottles.

DARPHUS
Drink deeply, drink well! Hercules is dead!

In the distance, Graegus howls gleefully. Then there is the cry of a terrified villager, followed by the sound of the Dog of War crunching his bones.



DARPHUS
Do you hear that? Every bite makes Graegus Stroger.

Soon
he'll be too big to stop, and we will
join with him to fulfil the mighty
Ares' destiny! The God of War will

Darphus raises his bottle high.



RESUME SCENE

Hercules dives to push Xena, Iolaus and Salmoneus to safety.

HERCULES

Look out!

But his warning is drowned out by the sound of the boulders landing with enough force to squash all of humanity. When the din subsides, we hear cruel, triumphant laughter.

AT THE TOP OF THE CANYON WALL

Darphus strides into view, laughing harder than ever as he beholds what his treachery hath wrought. And rising behind him to underscore his evil intentions are the EYES OF ARES.

FADE OUT.

END OF ACT ONE

Meanwhile, Hercules and Xena are laying waste to the warriors in their path. Darphus doesn't like what he sees. He doesn't like the knife that a miner throws into his chest, either. But he never falls from his horse, never even flinches.

The two warriors he has left are only too happy to obey his order. As they flee:

Salmoneus is led inside pleading. Suddenly, Darphus hears Iolaus' screams and a thunderous CRASH. He turns to see the cart exploding through the gates of the compound.

DARPHUS

Well, well. The son of Zeus has finally arrived.

Several warriors head off towards the wagon.

CUT TO:

48 EXT. COURTYARD - DAY

48

Using the distraction, Hercules and Xena charge out and begin battling Darphus' remaining warriors.

XENA

I thought it was supposed to be on fire.

HERCULES

Old hunter's tricks don't always work!

Darphus sees them approaching.

49A.

47B CONTINUED:

47B

DARPHUS You've got it all wrong. It's you who dies this time. You and Hercules. (drawing his sword)
And Ares will rule!

Let the rumble begin.

49 INT. TEMPLE - DAY - CONTINUING

49

PER STORYBOARDS

Salmoneus is shackled to the floor as the sentries high tail it out of the temple. He looks up fearfully and sees something stirring in the shadows. Something huge and growling. Salmoneus' life is passing in front of his eyes.

SALMONEUS

Nice doggy.

CUT TO:

50 DELETED

51 EXT. TEMPLE - DAY

51

50

Xena engages Darphus in a fierce battle on the temple steps, allowing Hercules to barrel through the temple doors. Salmoneus' screams lead the way.

XENA

I'm going to make sure you stay dead this time, Darphus.

DARPHUS

(evil smile)

You've got it all wrong. It's you who dies this time. And Hercules will be dessert for the Dog of War! Ares will rule!

CUT TO:

52 INT. - TEMPLE - DAY

52

PER STORYBOARDS

We finally get a good look at what Salmoneus has been screaming about. The Dog of War is nothing short of terrifying. Just as Graegus is about to pounce on Salmoneus, Hercules hurls a massive log to his head, knocking the dog silly. The effect is only temporary, but gives our heroes a slight advantage.

SALMONEUS

Hercules, that was great!

HERCULES

We're not out of this yet.

The dog is shaking off his headache and poised to lunge again. Hercules picks up a spear from the floor.

HERCULES

I wonder if he knows how to play fetch.

50A.

49B CONTINUED:

49B

DARPHUS

So did I.

And they begin their fight to the death.

53 EXT. ELYSIA - DAY

53

Iolaus confinues to battle Darphus' men. They seem to keep on coming.

CUT TO:

54 EXT. TEMPLE - DAY

54

Xena looks like she's done for. Two warriors have grabbed her, one by each arm, and Darphus is ready to run her through.

DARPHUS

You're mine!

But Xena does a backward flip, then swings the startled warriors in front of her so they're the ones Darphus kills.

XENA

Take them instead.

And her battle with Darphus resumes. He gets the upper hand and drives Xena into the temple.

CUT TO:

55 INT. TEMPLE - DAY

55

PER STORYBOARDS

Hercules continues to battle the dog. Xena and Darphus enter and continue their fight. Xena manages to free Salmoneus who runs for the door.

CUT TO:

56 EXT. ELYSIA - DAY

56

Salmoneus runs for the gates of the compound, but stops when he sees Iolaus fiercely battling a whole legion of soldiers. Salmoneus grabs a frying pan off of the cart and motions to Iolaus to send some people his way. One by one, Salmoneus bonks several soldiers on the head, allowing Iolaus to get the upper hand.

IOLAUS

Thanks!

SALMONEUS (flexing his muscles)

I'm the man!

49D EXT. TEMPLE - DAY

49D*

Xena looks like she's done for. Two warriors have grabbed her, one by each arm, and Darphus is ready to use his sword on her.

DARPHUS

You're mine!

57 INT. TEMPLE - DAY

57

PER STORYBOARDS

Hercules and Graegus continue to fight. Hercules manages to chain up the dog.

CUT TO:

58 EXT. ELYSLA - DAY

58

Salmoneus and Iolaus finish off the last of the soldiers.

IOLAUS

C'mon. Our friends need our help.

SALMONEUS

Right.

As they take off, four more guards cross their path. Iolaus raises his sword while Salmoneus raises his skillet to the ready.

CUT TO:

59 INT. TEMPLE - DAY

59

PER STORYBOARDS

In the midst of all this, he glances at Xena, who is battling Darphus down the stairs.

HERCULES

Xena!

When she looks his way, he motions her toward him and Graegus. What follows is the beautiful, almost sexual choreography that Hercules and Xena employ to get Darphus and Graegus where they want them. Darphus and Graegus think just the opposite when Hercules and Xena are back-to-back. Graegus opens his horrifying mouth and Darphus raises his sword two-handed, as if it were an ax.

Xena makes a spinning move, Hercules dodges Graegus and — presto! - Graegus mistakenly consumes Darphus in one bite. He must taste bad, though, because Graegus starts choking on him almost immediately. But it doesn't look like the Dog of War is going to die when he splits in two. Xena raises her sword.

YENIA

Great, one for each of us.

52A.

49E CONTINUED:

49E

Together, they watch Graegus split again. And again. And again. He doesn't stop until he's dust at our hero's feet.

Enos squints in disbelief at what's happening.

ENOS

I'm getting while the getting's good.

He runs for his life while Salmoneus tries to get a closer look. But a whirlwind springs up, making the dust impossible to examine.

59

59 CONTINUED: 2

Hercules puts his arm up to stop her.

HERCULES

Wait.

Together, they watch Graegus split again. And again. And again. He doesn't stop until he's dust at our hero's feet.

Iolaus and Salmoneus run into the temple and watch in amazement.

IOLAUS

I've never seen anything like that. What happened?

HERCULES

He choked on the poison that was inside Darphus.

SALMONEUS

And I thought I had indigestion.

The whirlwind grows stronger. The dust begins to blow away.

XENA

But Darphus had Ares on his side.

HERCULES

It didn't matter. Evil always cancels itself out.

Suddenly, the wind reaches full force, scattering the dust that once was Graegus and signalling Ares' defeat, at least for the moment.

DISSOLVE TO:

60 EXT. ELYSIA - DAY

60

Salmoneus is still overflowing with excitement. Hercules and Iolaus are just glad the battle is over.

SALMONEUS

Did you see those turkeys fall when Iolaus pushed them over to me? They were like tenpins.

(off his friends' puzzlement)
You know what tenpins are. Anyway that
was an incredible experience. I'd write about
it if . . .

Salmoneus is empty-handed until Hercules dips into the top of his boot and pulls out the tireless schemer's notebook.

60 CONTINUED: 2

HERCULES

Is this what you need?

SALMONEUS

My notebook! Oh, thank you, thank you, thank you. . .

IOLAUS

(to Hercules; teasing)

The problem with Salmoneus is, you never know how he feels about anything.

HERCULES

He'll have to work on that.

SALMONEUS

Go ahead, laugh. But you two are going to miss me.

HERCULES

Where are you going?

SALMONEUS

Nowhere. I'm staying right here. If my celebrity biography of you doesn't work out, I can always sell the real estate.

IOLAUS

Don't count on me buying any. I'm heading for home. You with me, Hercules?

HERCULES

There's someone I need to talk to before I can make any decisions.

Off a look that can only be called wistful -

CUT TO:

61

61 EXT. WOODED AREA - DAY

In the place where she and Hercules made love, Xena is getting the horse Darphus rode ready to travel. Hercules is at her side, but for the longest time, neither of them can speak. Finally:

XENA

You're going to make this tougher for me than it already is, aren't you?

TO

Prod. #76613 - 1/18/95 - Pink

51 CONTINUED:

51

Hercules needs another beat to recover from that one.

61

61 CONTINUED: 2

HERCULES

If I knew what you were talking about, I might be able to give you an answer.

XENA

I'm talking about leaving.
(a beat)

Without you.

Hercules needs another beat to recover from that one.

HERCULES

It doesn't have to be that way.

XENA

Don't, please. You're going to make me cry, and I haven't done that since I was a child.

Tears are starting to trickle down her cheeks.

HERCULES

Xena...

He takes her in his arms and they kiss.

XENA

Just let me go. There's so much in my life I need to make amends for, and I have to get started.

HERCULES

I wish you'd let me help.

XENA

You already have. You unchained my heart.

They kiss one more time. And then:

XENA

Goodbye, Hercules.

She climbs aboard her horse and rides away without looking back. There's nothing Hercules can do but watch her as his face becomes a study in sadness. He doesn't even hear Iolaus walk up beside him.

IOLAUS Are you going to be alright?

Hercules ponders the question for a long beat.

HERCULES Yeah, I think so. After all, the good guys did win.

FADE OUT.

END OF ACT FOUR
