FADE IN:

1 EXT. SPACE - THE ENTERPRISE (OPTICAL)

> The ship is in standard orbit over an old and scarred planet. The world is predominantly gray with overtones of flecked green and brown and conveys an impression of an old battlefield coming back to life.

> > CUT TO:

2 INT. MAIN BRIDGE

> PICARD and RIKER are standing near an access station observing the play of information across one of the monitors. WESLEY is at the Conn, DATA is at Ops and TROI is in the command area, while SEVERAL N.D. CREWMEMBERS are at duty stations or passing through the Bridge.

> > DATA

Away Team reporting in, Commander. Lieutenant Worf standing by.

RIKER

This is Riker, report Lieutenant.

WORF'S COM VOICE The archeologists have identified the markings in these caverns. This planet was apparently once home to a race known as the Koinonians.

PICARD

What do we know about them, Data?

DATA

The Koinonians were an intelligent culture which became embroiled in a war that lasted several generations. Our best evidence indicates they destroyed themselves.

CONTINUED:

WORF'S COM VOICE

We have completed our survey of the third tunnel and will proceed into the ceremonial chamber.

RIKER

Affirmative. Enterprise out.

PICARD

Destroyed themselves, Data?

DATA

According to historical records. This will be the first opportunity for a Federation team...

At this point, Troi's eyes suddenly go wide.

TROI

Captain! Beam them up quickly! They---

Before she can complete her warning, the voice of Worf breaks in over the COM channel.

WORF'S COM VOICE

Emergency beam-up! Enterprise, emergency! Injuries. Away---

PICARD

Transporter Room!

O'BRIEN'S COM VOICE

I've got them, Captain.

PICARD

Beam them straight to Sickbay. Doctor Crusher, incoming wounded.

There is a tense pause while they wait for word. Troi senses what has happened and shakes her head sadly when Riker looks at her.

CUT TO:

INT. SICKBAY (OPTICAL) 2A

DOCTOR CRUSHER and a MEDICAL ENSIGN move to the Away Team as four people MATERIALIZE.

2A CONTINUED:

WORF is crouched in a defensive position over the prone and motionless form of LIEUTENANT MARLA ASTER, a woman in her early thirties. Worf's phaser is out and at the ready while his uniform is singed and slightly torn, blood flows from a small wound in his shoulder. Behind him are TWO N.D. CREWMEMBERS, who are archeological officers. Beverly and Medical Supernumeraries move into action...

CUT TO:

- 3 OMITTED
- INT. MAIN BRIDGE

While Troi is already sure of the result, the rest of the Bridge crew waits for word from Sickbay.

> BEVERLY'S COM VOICE Away Team is aboard, Captain. (beat) One dead on arrival.

Picard and the Bridge crew react.

FADE OUT.

END OF TEASER

ACT ONE

FADE IN:

EXT. SPACE - THE ENTERPRISE (OPTICAL)

in orbit.

PICARD (V.O.)

Captain's Log: Stardate 43506.5 The Enterprise remains in standard orbit while we investigate the tragedy which has struck the Away Team.

CUT TO:

6 INT. SICKBAY

Picard is standing in the doorway. Beverly stands over the bed holding Marla Aster's body. Worf stands nearby. His uniform bears the evidence of the recent violent encounter, blood still seeps from his wound.

> PICARD (V.O) (continuing)

Lieutenant Marla Aster, ship's archaeologist has been killed in what should have been a routine mission. Whatever the explanation, it will not bring back a valued and trusted officer.

A MEDICAL SUPERNUMERARY moves the bed Aster's body is resting on into an isolated area of Sickbay. Another member of the Away Team is being examined by Beverly in the background, as Worf makes his report to Picard.

6 CONTINUED:

WORF

We had completed our investigation of the third tunnel. Our scans had indicated no weapons or traps of any kind. Lieutenant Aster was three meters behind me. An explosive device went off. There was no warning. Lieutenant Aster bore the full brunt of the detonation.

(pause)

I was in command. I bear full responsibility.

PICARD

Lieutenant. I have the utmost faith that you acted properly and in the best traditions of Starfleet.

Beverly moves over to Worf.

BEVERLY

Let's take a look at that shoulder...

Troi ENTERS the Sickbay.

6 CONTINUED: (2)

TROI

Lieutenant Aster is survived by a son, Jeremy. Twelve years old.

PICARD

What about his father?

TROI

He is also deceased, Captain.

Picard and Beverly exchange a glance.

TROI

(continuing)

His only living relatives are an aunt and uncle residing on Earth.

PICARD

Where is the boy now?

TROI

In class. I've alerted the teacher to expect us.

Picard acknowledges. He glances at Beverly, who is still troubled by the loss of a patient, but can identify with the Captain's unpleasant task. Picard and Troi then turn and prepare to leave the Sickbay.

WORF

Captain.

Worf swings off the biobed.

WORF

(continuing)

I must accompany you. I commanded the Away Team.

PICARD

I appreciate the offer but this is my responsibility.

Worf acknowledges, unhappily...

6 CONTINUED: (3)

BEVERLY

Go to your quarters. Rest. You're relieved of duty for twenty-four hours.

Worf opens his mouth.

BEVERLY

(continuing)

That's an order.

Worf EXITS. Picard keys his insignia on their way out.

6A INT. CORRIDOR

PICARD

Picard to Bridge.

RIKER'S COM VOICE

Yes, Captain.

PICARD

Assign Commander La Forge to lead another Away Team to the digsite. I want to know why this happened...

7 INT. MAIN BRIDGE

Riker at Command. Wesley at Conn, Data at Ops, Supernumerary at tactical.

RIKER

Yes, Captain.

And pull back to include Wes in the foreground.

PICARD'S COM VOICE

I will be with Counselor Troi and young Jeremy Aster.

RIKER

(with sympathy)

I understand. Riker out.

Wes exchanges a glance with Riker. A sad memory --

WESLEY

He had to do the same thing for me.

7 CONTINUED:

Riker nods, he knows.

RIKER

Do you know Jeremy well?

WESLEY

(shakes his head)

But I know what it'll be like for him.

RIKER

It's part of life in Starfleet, Wesley.

WESLEY

(acknowledges)

They're very careful to prepare us for... anything. Still...

RIKER

I know.

WESLEY

How can you ever get used to it... to telling them...?

RIKER

(softly)

You hope you never do.

Data has been listening with interest to this exchange.

CUT TO:

8
thru OMITTED

10 INT. WORF'S QUARTERS

The room is very dark. Worf is dressed in an elaborate Klingon robe and sash. A strange, twisted, massive candle burns on the desk before him.

He studies the candle with painful eyes for several beats and then hangs his head with shame. He reaches out very deliberately, and snuffs the candle with the flat side of a knife blade. Darkness.

CUT TO:

10A INT. TURBOLIFT

Troi and Picard. She senses his frustration.

TROT

I sense the weight of this duty on you, Captain...

Picard begins to deny it, but then, frustrated --

PICARD

I really wonder...

He's almost letting his feelings show, which is not at all comfortable for him. He stops the Turbolift in mid-trip...

PICARD

(to computer)

Halt.

The Turbolift stops...

PICARD

I've always believed that carrying children on a starship... it's a questionable policy.

She listens, gives him room...

PICARD

(continuing)

Serving on a starship means accepting certain risks and dangers. But did Jeremy Aster make that choice?

TROI

Death and loss are an integral part of life everywhere. Leaving the boy on Earth would not have protected him from that.

PICARD

No, but Earth is not likely to be ordered to the Neutral Zone to repel a Romulan attack...

(beat, softer)

It was my command which sent his mother to her death. She understood her mission and my duty. Will he?

10A CONTINUED:

TROI

In time. With help.

(beat)

Ensign Crusher does.

A beat. He glances at her and perhaps we sense that Picard wonders if Wesley really ever has come to an understanding since they have both avoided the subject. In response to that feeling, re-emphasizing --

TROI

(continuing)

Yes, he does. And so will Jeremy.

And she is doing her job for the Captain now... easing, but not closing, a lingering issue for him.

PICARD

(to computer)

Resume.

- 11 OMITTED
- 12 INT. CLASSROOM

Picard and Troi ENTER. The classroom is warm, inviting and is crammed with plants, computers, antique books, and myriad games from across the Federation. TWO TEACHERS are working with SEVERAL STUDENTS in two study groups.

In one group, the age of the students run from roughly 8 to 13, and they are discussing a particular problem on a computer display screen around which they are all clustered. In the B.G., is the other study group studying other instruction devices. As Picard and Troi enter, the students look up in surprise and several point at the seldom-seen Captain of their ship. Conversation dies to a whisper. The nearest teacher hates like hell what his student is about to endure, but he stands and crosses to JEREMY ASTER.

TEACHER

Jeremy, the Captain needs to talk with you.

The boy's eyes go wide at this summons from the Captain. He is about twelve years old and has a quiet, sensitive look about him, with tousled black hair and deep-set eyes.

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12 CONTINUED:

The other children look at him with reactions ranging from jealousy to fear. He walks forward with his teacher's arm around his shoulders.

JEREMY

I'm Jeremy, sir.

12 CONTINUED: (3)

Picard looks down at this innocent young face... the eyes of a twelve year old.

TEACHER

(indicates)

My office is over there, Captain...

Picard acknowledges. The teacher indicates the way. Troi puts her arm around the boy and the trio walks out of the room.

13 OMITTED

13A INT. TEACHER'S OFFICE (FROM SCENE 13)

Troi has her hands on Jeremy's shoulders to offer the support of physical contact.

PICARD

Jeremy, it is my sad duty to tell you that your mother has died.

And whatever our expectations might have been, we can throw them away. This is a 24th century child. He is a good soldier, uniquely mature. Prepared by experts to cope with the worst circumstances. There is no tear shed.

JEREMY

How, sir?

PICARD

An explosive device at the mission site. She died instantly.

JEREMY

I understand.

Troi drops to one knee to be at his level...

TROI

I know your mother loved you very much, Jeremy.

He nods. A silence.

13A CONTINUED:

PICARD

I've been told... you've also lost your father.

JEREMY

Yessir. Five years ago. From a Rushton Infection. I'm alone now, sir.

And Picard may wonder just how 'mature' any of us could be in this circumstance. But whatever is going on inside, the boy does not reveal it.

PICARD

(softly)

No one is alone on the starship Enterprise, Jeremy. No one.

As the boy and Picard look in each other's eyes...

FADE OUT.

END OF ACT ONE

ACT TWO

FADE IN:

14 EXT. SPACE - THE ENTERPRISE (OPTICAL)

The Enterprise in orbit around the planet.

- 15 OMITTED
- 16 INT. ASTER QUARTERS

Troi and Jeremy. Troi is seated, watching Jeremy with that cool serenity which is so much a part of her nature. He doesn't quite know what to do with himself. But throughout the scene there is a repressed anger in the boy. (NOTE: This is a significant change... Even though the dialogue may be similar, the attitude behind must reflect unfocused anger that he is unwilling to touch.)

JEREMY

I really ought to get back to class... if I get behind...

Bringing the focus back --

TROI

I'm sure your mom wanted you to do well in school. Wasn't she a teacher on Earth?

JEREMY

(acknowledges)

She taught exo-archeology.

TROI

Why did she sign on the Enterprise?

JEREMY

She said she wanted to see the galaxy with her own eyes.

TROI

Was she happy doing that?

JEREMY

(trace of bitterness.)
Yeah. Real happy.

16 CONTINUED:

TROI

Did she ever tell you there was a chance this might happen someday?

JEREMY

Yes.

He moves away from her, seems drawn to the computer terminal on his desk. He is completely unaware he is doing this, but Troi has spotted the motion.

TROI

It might help if we talked about how you're feeling.

Curt --

JEREMY

You're a Betazoid. You know how I feel.

TROI

(conversationally)

When my father died we were living on Betazed. My mother and all her people are telepathic. I kept wanting to talk about my father, and they kept pulling my thoughts out of my head before I could say the words. It made me very angry.

JEREMY

(curious despite
 himself)

Why?

TROI

I needed to say them out loud. I was confused about why he went away. Was it me -- something I had done. I felt that if I could just say the words he would somehow know how much I loved him and missed him.

She looks at him.

16 CONTINUED: (2)

TROI

(continuing)

I thought you might feel the same way.

JEREMY

(avoiding his
feelings)

She just had to do her job. I understand that.

TROI

Did she talk to you about her mission before she left?

JEREMY

She told me about the ruins.

(a beat, softer)

She always made it like a story book.

He's back at the computer.

TROI

Why do you keep going over to the terminal?

JEREMY

(beat)

No reason.

A long beat.

JEREMY

(continuing)

It's nothing. I broke it yesterday.

TROI

(studies him a beat)

Was your mother angry when you broke it?

He nods.

TROI

(continuing)

Was she still angry when she left?

He doesn't acknowledge, but obviously she was.

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16 CONTINUED: (3)

TROI

(continuing)

Jeremy, did that broken terminal cause the accident?

JEREMY

No.

TROI

Did you cause the accident?

JEREMY

No. I just never had a chance to tell her I fixed it.

TROT

Jeremy, if your mother were here right now, would she forgive you?

Jeremy swallows hard. Still no tears. He nods his head, yes, sighs a deep breath. Troi knows that's a big step for now.

TROI

(standing; continuing)
I want you to have some time
alone for a little while. I'll
come back when you're ready to
talk again.

JEREMY

How will you know?

Troi crosses to the boy, hugs him lightly, then still holding him in the circle of her arms she smiles down at him and says,

TROI

This time I will use my Betazoid sense, and I'll know.

His eyes say he's beginning to appreciate her. Troi EXITS.

17

thru OMITTED

17B

17C INT. TEN-FORWARD

Riker is seated at a table. He stares out at the stars. There is a drink in front of him.

17C CONTINUED:

SIX OTHER PEOPLE and a BARTENDER are also present. Data crosses to Riker. The Commander looks up.

DATA

Excuse me. Am I intruding?

RIKER

No, sit down.

There is a curious subtext to his question --

DATA

How well did you know Lieutenant Aster?

RIKER

We spent some time together. Not very well.

A beat, Data waits for more... his face is very inquisitive. Off his look --

RIKER

How well did you know her?

DATA

Why do you ask?

RIKER

(reacts)

Well... I mean you just asked me...

DATA

But why do you ask the question? I have been asked several times to define 'how well I knew Lieutenant Aster' since her death. And I heard you ask Wesley on the Bridge if he knew Jeremy well.

(beat)

Does the question of familiarity have some bearing on death?

RIKER

(a beat)

Do you remember how we all felt when Tasha died?

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17C CONTINUED: (2)

DATA

I do not sense the same feelings of... absence... that I associate with Lieutenant Yar... although I cannot say precisely why...

RIKER

That's just human nature, Data.

DATA

Human nature, sir?

RIKER

We feel a loss more intensely when it's a friend.

DATA

But should not the feelings be just as deep regardless of who has died?

Riker thinks this over before answering.

RIKER

Maybe they should, Data. Maybe if we felt the loss of any life as keenly as we felt the death of those close to us, our history would've been a lot less bloody.

Data considers this as...

GEORDI'S COM VOICE

La Forge to Riker...

RIKER

You're back, Geordi...

GEORDI'S COM VOICE Yessir, and we've brought back a souvenir...

17D INT. CAPTAIN'S READY ROOM

Geordi giving his report to Picard and Riker. He has brought back another explosive device... Data studies it.

17D CONTINUED:

GEORDI

Five more just like it... all identical to the one that killed Lieutenant Aster...

DATA

They employ a subspace proximity detonator. A normal tricorder would never detect it.

19.

17D CONTINUED:

PICARD

How long would you say they've been there, Data?

DATA

It comes from the time of the Koinonian Wars, Captain...

RIKER

Did you find them all, Geordi?

GEORDI

Yeah. But...

(off their looks)

Well, they were all sort of... left there to be found.

PICARD

Left by whom? There are no indications of life on this planet.

GEORDI

I don't know, Captain... but it was pretty obvious that they'd been recently pulled out of the ground and defused.

Off their reactions...

CUT TO:

18 INT. CORRIDOR

Troi is walking, head down, very thoughtful. Worf is coming from the other direction. He sees her, checks, and almost heads down another branching corridor. But Troi senses him and looks up.

TROI

Worf!

The Klingon stops, but he's clearly uncomfortable.

WORF

(formally)

Counselor.

There is an uneasy silence.

18 CONTINUED:

TROI

I can understand that you don't want to talk about what happened.

Worf glances around the corridor, and Troi understands his reticence in such a public place. She looks around and motions to a small room. Worf, with great dignity, follows her inside.

19 INT. COMPUTER ROOM

The room is dimly lit and only Worf and Troi are here at present.

WORF

I have made my report to the Captain.

TROI

I'm more interested in how you feel about what happened.

(a beat)

And right now I sense great anger.

Worf stiffens and only confirms Troi's perception.

WORF

I cannot seek revenge against an enemy who turned to dust centuries ago.

Troi merely waits. Her attitude is clam and quiet. She is making no judgments.

WORF

(continuing)

Her death was senseless. The last victim of a forgotten war.

TROI

Go on.

Her eyes are locked with Worf's, she is very still, helping him to speak, but applying no pressure.

WORF

There is no more to be said.

19 CONTINUED:

TROI

A person has died while under your command. It may happen again. If you cannot learn to release the anger and the guilt, to talk about it...

WORF

A leader must stand alone. As Captain Picard does.

TROI

(a little sharply)
Captain Picard talks to me.

A beat. Worf realizes he cannot get off the hook here. But this "sharing feelings" is as alien a concept as he will ever encounter. Reluctantly --

WORF

Then may I seek your counsel about my plan to make the R'uustai with the boy...

And she's caught off guard by something so... well, Klingon-intense...

TROI

The Bonding.

And her reaction is exactly what he feared. Already he hates this $\ensuremath{\mathsf{--}}$

WORF

It is my right.

TROI

It's a very generous offer, but he's not a Klingon child. He has different sensibilities.

WORF

He is an orphan. I am an orphan. He will understand.

A long beat. And that is as close as Worf gets to exposing his feelings. And she appreciates that.

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19 CONTINUED: (2)

TROI

Right now, there isn't much he can understand, Worf. He's holding all his feelings inside... (beat)

Children often feel they must be true to the memory of a lost parent.

(MORE)

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19 CONTINUED: (3)

TROI (Cont'd)

If you offer affection to them too soon they can feel guilty returning that affection. As if they're betraying the love they feel for the parent.

WORF

I only wish to honor his mother.

TROI

I know. And I understand this means a great deal to you. But you must be prepared, Worf... he is very angry too, but his anger is deep inside him... When he finally touches it, it will strike out in many directions... including yours.

(a beat)

Talk with him. Be with him. But do not rush this. When he is ready, we will know.

Worf acknowledges and proceeds on his way, and Troi watches him.

CUT TO:

20 thru OMITTED 22

22A INT. ASTER QUARTERS (OPTICAL)

Jeremy is curled up on the sofa looking at a hand held screen with a home video of him and his mother together at home on Earth... his face is thoughtful, reflective, not in pain. There is a CHIME. He goes to the door, touches the panel and it opens to reveal Worf.

WORF

Jeremy Aster, I am Lieutenant Worf. May I enter?

Worf ENTERS... he wants desperately to do the right thing... but is now aware of Troi's concerns. The boy stares coldly at him... But the anger is all repressed, not overt. STAR TREK: "The Bonding" - REV. 8/25/89 - ACT TWO 22A.

22A CONTINUED:

JEREMY

You were in command of the Away

Team.

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22A CONTINUED: (2)

WORF

Yes. I was with Lieutenant Aster, your mother, when she died.

(guilty)

Her death lies between us. It is my hope...that...someday... it can also bind us.

Jeremy doesn't know what that means, it's just another nice sounding 'I'm sorry.'

JEREMY

(with an attitude)
You're a Klingon, aren't you?

Worf doesn't know how to take that exactly...

WORF

Yes.

JEREMY

We studied Klingons in school.

WORF

What do they teach you about us?

JEREMY

You used to be our enemies.

Worf acknowledges, tries to say something meaningful to the boy...

WORF

Do they teach you that every Klingon hopes to die in the line of duty as your mother did?

Jeremy just looks at him, refusing to connect.

WORF

In my tradition, we do not grieve the loss of the body... we celebrate the releasing of the spirit.

Jeremy looks at the imposing figure... confident, you can't tell me anything I don't already know -

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22A CONTINUED: (3)

JEREMY

I understand death. They teach

us all about it.

Worf studies the twelve-year-old for a long beat.

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22A CONTINUED: (4)

WORF

Jeremy Aster, we may both understand it, but we must bring meaning to your mother's death.

(beat)

Perhaps we can do it together.

Jeremy's reaction suggests he doesn't see how...

22B

thru OMITTED

22C

22D INT. CAPTAIN'S READY ROOM

The Captain is going over status reports on the computer screen as the DOORBELL RINGS.

PICARD

Come.

The door slides open and Troi stands there...

PICARD

Counselor. How is the boy?

TROI

He is being very brave.

PICARD

Good.

TROI

No. He'll have to get past brave. He is a very angry boy... He must learn to express that anger before he can really say good-bye to his mother.

She sits.

PICARD

How can we help?

TROI

I've asked Beverly if we might get Wesley to talk to Jeremy about his father's death...

Picard acknowledges.

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22D CONTINUED:

TROI

The one unusual element is Worf.

PICARD

Oh?

TROI

In many ways he is suffering as badly as the boy. He wishes to involve Jeremy in a Klingon ceremony called the R'uustai... the bonding...

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22D CONTINUED: (2)

PICARD

I know it.

(thoughtful)

Perhaps it would be a comfort to both your patients, Counselor.

TROI

I don't think the boy would accept Worf right now. Later, perhaps. But it will have to be handled most delicately.

PICARD

As you always do.

Picard pauses, and looks at Troi with appreciation.

PICARD

(continuing)

I break the unpleasant news and my responsibility ends. You have to stay with them through the entire grieving process.

TROI

We find many different ways to deal with our pain, but over the years, I've discovered it is in our joy that the uniqueness of each individual is revealed. If I can help a person back to a state of joy... well, my role has its rewards.

RIKER'S COM VOICE Captain, we're picking up an energy field on the planet's surface...

22E INT. MAIN BRIDGE - CONTINUOUS

As Picard and Troi ENTER...

PICARD

Location?

RIKER

Two kilometers north of the Away Team's beamdown point.

22E CONTINUED:

PICARD

Indeed.

(to Data)

Full scan.

Data works his console.

DATA

Inconclusive, Captain.

TROI

Sir, I sense a... presence on the planet. Very vague.

PICARD

A life form?

TROI

I can't be sure... the emotions of the crew are particularly strong right now and it's difficult to filter them out.

PICARD

Data, scan analysis on Main Viewer...

As Data works...

22F INT. DOCTOR CRUSHER'S OFFICE

Wesley ENTERS. Beverly is at her desk, working.

BEVERLY

Hi.

WESLEY

(a little glum)

Hi.

He sort of plops down... something on his mind, not necessarily about to talk about it. She continues her work, talks without making eye contact...

BEVERLY

Troi stopped by a little while ago. She was wondering if you might be willing to talk to Jeremy Aster at some point.

STAR TREK: "The Bonding" - REV. 8/28/89 - ACT TWO 27.

2F CONTINUED:

WESLEY

(uncomfortable)

Me? What for?

She looks up.

BEVERLY

Because of your Dad.

Wesley frowns... he's already been revisiting those memories today.

WESLEY

What would I tell him?

BEVERLY

It would help him to talk with someone who's gone through this.

Wesley sighs, would rather not... how do I get out of this?

BEVERLY

We had each other, Wes... he doesn't have anyone to lean on now... and he might be more comfortable talking about it with someone who's not much older...

WESLEY

(interrupting, don't
bug me)

Okay. Let me think about it.

BEVERLY

(beat)

Okay.

A long beat.

WESLEY

You ever think about him, Mom?

BEVERLY

Your father?

(she nods)

Sure, I do.

A long beat. And this is hard on Wesley...

STAR TREK: "The Bonding" - REV. 8/23/89 - ACT TWO 28.

22F CONTINUED: (2)

WESLEY

Sometimes I can't quite remember his face... it scares me.

Beverly studies him...

BEVERLY

That happens to all of us, Wes... (beat; honest)

Sometimes I can't get his face out of my mind.

WESLEY

(nods)

Today... it's like I can see it all as clearly as if it were yesterday... the way he looked when he hugged me good-bye... Captain Picard's eyes when he came to tell us...

Their eyes meet. A tear slides down his cheek. She comes over and they hold each other.

CUT TO:

22G INT. MAIN BRIDGE - (OPTICAL) (PREVIOUSLY 22A)

As before. On the viewscreen is a graphic analysis of the energy form they're tracking on the planet...

RIKER

Data, run comparison with known phenomena.

DATA

(works his station)
The pattern has no exact match
in Federation records.

PICARD

Is it alive?

DATA

A possibility.

And Troi just watches it... slow push in on her....

STAR TREK: "The Bonding" - REV. 8/25/89 - ACT TWO 29.

22G CONTINUED:

GEORDI'S COM VOICE Captain, I'm getting an unusual magnetic flux reading from the anti-matter containment pods.

... to an extreme closeup of Troi ending as she senses something new, something extreme as she murmurs...

TROI

My God.

CUT TO:

23 INT. ASTER QUARTERS (OPTICAL)

Jeremy is seated at the desk once again studying the moving picture of him and his mother. He senses movement from a hallway behind him, turns to see the arrival of MARLA ASTER. Jeremy's eyes go wide.

JEREMY

Mom!

FADE OUT.

END OF ACT TWO

STAR TREK: "The Bonding" - REV. 8/23/89 - ACT THREE 30.

ACT THREE

FADE IN:

24 EXT. SPACE - THE ENTERPRISE (OPTICAL)

The starship is still cruising serenely in orbit.

25

thru OMITTED

30

31 INT. MAIN BRIDGE (OPTICAL)

As before. Riker and Picard have moved to join Geordi at the Engineering station, studying the odd readings...

GEORDI

All systems are functioning normally -- still, there's a fluctuation in the containment field. I can't account for it.

RIKER

Data, is it related in some way to the energy field on the planet?

And Troi is still getting those radical vibes...

TROI

(sotto voce)

Captain...

DATA

There is a beam of highly charged particles emanating from the planet...

TROI

Captain, there is a presence aboard the Enterprise.

Reactions.

PICARD

An alien presence...?

She doesn't know...

RIKER

No intruder noted by the ship's sensors, Captain...

TROI

A presence...

Beginning behind the above --

RIKER

Security, all decks... yellow alert... possible intruder...

On Troi trying to come to grips with her senses...

CUT TO:

31A INT. ASTER QUARTERS

Jeremy stares with bewilderment up at his mother. Marla Aster reaches out to brush a hand across Jeremy's hair. Jeremy reflexively backs away.

JEREMY

They said you were dead.

MARLA

There was a mistake. It's okay.

Jeremy is confused. He's yearning to accept this, but still he holds back.

JEREMY

But there was an explosion... you were hurt.

MARLA

Jeremy, I'm not hurt. I'm fine. You mustn't think any more about it.

She moves to him. He backs away from her.

MARLA

The important thing is, I'll never leave you again.

She smiles at him, crosses to the desk.

MARLA

(continuing)

Oh, I see you fixed the terminal.

JEREMY

Just after you. you left.

MARLA

I'm sorry I got so angry about
that. I'm really proud of you
-- you fixed it without even
being asked.

This woman is damned convincing. But Jeremy is still reluctant to accept her. Marla extends her hand.

Slowly, cautiously, Jeremy reaches out, touches Marla's hand. It's warm and real. Jeremy's surprised. He gazes at Marla -- he desperately wants this to be his mother.

MARLA

(warm smile)

I think somebody needs a hug.

And that does it. Jeremy gives himself up to the fantasy, buries himself in his mother's arms, and for the first time since the accident, SOBS softly. Marla comforts him, strokes his head. Everything's all right now.

After a long beat, Marla pulls back, takes Jeremy's hand.

MARLA

We have to go now.

JEREMY

Where?

MARLA

To the planet. That's where we're going to live now.

JEREMY

(confused again)

We're not going to stay on the Enterprise any more?

MARLA

No.

(a beat)

We're going to live in a home just like we used to on Earth.

Jeremy's not sure about this, but Marla's warmth and serenity allay his doubts:

STAR TREK: "The Bonding" - REV. 8/25/89 - ACT THREE 33.

31A CONTINUED: (2)

MARLA

(continuing)

You'll see. I promise.

There is a CHIME. Jeremy moves to the door, opens it to reveal Worf... Jeremy is excited. (There is no repressed anger any more.)

JEREMY

Lieutenant Worf... did they tell you? It was a mistake.

Worf reacts to the boy's glee, then as he steps in, is blown away as ?? sees Marla smiling at him...

JEREMY

(continuing)

She didn't die. She's alive.

As the boy moves to her...

WORF

Jeremy, come here...

MARLA

Lieutenant Worf, it's all right. I'm here for the boy.

Worf starts to pull his phaser, and doesn't know what the hell to do with it... even he has to wonder a moment - is it Marla Aster? He touches his insignia.

WORF

Lieutenant Worf to Captain Picard.

CUT TO:

- 32 OMITTED
- 33 INT. MAIN BRIDGE

As before.

PICARD

Go ahead.

WORF'S COM VOICE

Lieutenant Aster is in her quarters.

Exchanged looks.

RIKER

Repeat, Worf...?

WORF'S COM VOICE Lieutenant Aster. She's here. In her quarters. With the boy.

Reactions. Picard and Troi exchange a look.

PICARD

Do not provoke her or interfere in any way until I arrive. Picard out.

(to Riker)

Have security moving that way but tell them to keep their distance. You have the Bridge. Counselor...

Troi's already out of her chair. She and Picard EXIT.

CUT TO:

33A INT. ASTER QUARTERS

Marla looks calmly at Worf.

MARLA

There's nothing to worry about. I'm going to take care of Jeremy and make him happy.

(to Jeremy)

It's time to go.

WORF

Where are you taking the child?

JEREMY

To the planet.

Marla smiles a winning smile at Jeremy:

MARLA

Come on, Jeremy.

Jeremy dutifully leaves Worf, joins Marla, takes her hand. Together they EXIT followed by Worf, who keys his insignia...

WORF

Worf to Picard, they're leaving their quarters...

35

34

thru OMITTED

36 INT. CORRIDOR

Worf follows Marla and Jeremy down the corridor. Security men arriving do not interfere, exchange glances with Worf, trail...

WORF

(keys insignia)

Captain, I believe we're headed for Transporter Room Three.

36A INT. TURBOLIFT

Picard and Troi moving quickly...

PICARD

We're on our way.

CUT TO:

- 37 OMITTED
- 38 INT. TRANSPORTER ROOM (OPTICAL)

O'Brien is making adjustments to the transporter side panels. He is running a monitor over the circuits and comparing readings. The DOOR OPENS and Marla, Jeremy, and Worf ENTER.

O'Brien reacts to the presence of a dead woman in his transporter room. Looks to Worf. Marla smiles sunnily at the Transporter Chief.

MARLA

Chief O'Brien, Jeremy and I are going down to the surface.

Marla and Jeremy cross to the platform. Jeremy lets go of Marla's hand so they can stand on separate pads.

The DOORS OPEN. In the corridor are Picard, Troi, and two SECURITY PERSONNEL; Picard motions for the Security Personnel to remain in the corridor as he and Troi ENTER. Picard gives Marla a hard look.

PICARD

Who are you?

MARLA

I'm Marla Aster...

JEREMY

(you know)

It's my mother, Captain... She's alive.

Picard glances with concern at Jeremy.

PICARD

(to Marla)

What do you want?

MARLA

To take my child down to the planet.

PICARD

I cannot permit that. This child is my responsibility.

Marla truly can't fathom why these people are making such a big deal out of nothing. Jeremy is confused and not at all clear what is going on...

MARLA

I'm here to care for him. He needs me. Why do you resist?

PICARD

Because I don't know who -- or what -- you are.

JEREMY

Can't you see who she is?

STAR TREK: "The Bonding" - REV. 8/24/89 - ACT THREE 36A.

38 CONTINUED: (2)

PICARD

Jeremy, she appears to be your mother, but she is not.

JEREMY

What do you mean?

STAR TREK: "The Bonding" - REV. 8/23/89 - ACT THREE 37.

38 CONTINUED: (2)

Jeremy looks to his mother...

MARLA

You're confusing the boy...

Picard glances at Worf, who has moved casually towards the Transporter pads... He takes the boy and pulls him away from his mother...

JEREMY

Wait...

He struggles, behind him, Marla's at a total loss...

JEREMY

(continuing)

No...stop...

Behind him, she suddenly VANISHES. Jeremy turns and she's gone...

JEREMY

Mon...Mom...

TROI

Jeremy...

JEREMY

NO...

As Troi escorts him out... off Picard and Worf's expressions:

thru OMITTED

40

FADE OUT.

END OF ACT THREE

ACT FOUR

FADE IN:

- 41 OMITTED
- 42 INT. CORRIDOR

Troi and Jeremy walking together. The boy is angry, frightened and sad, completely disoriented.

JEREMY

What did you do to her?

TROI

Jeremy, I don't know what that was, but it was not your mother.

JEREMY

You saw her... She was here...

TROI

Your mother is dead.

JEREMY

I touched her. She was real.

TROI

Why would your real mother want you to go to the planet. There's nothing there but rocks and dust...

And Jeremy knows his real mother wouldn't do that... but still, it was her... they have reached the Aster quarters. Troi keys the door, and they ENTER.

43 INT. EARTH HOME (OPTICAL)

And Troi takes an involuntary step back for it is no longer the Enterprise stateroom. They are standing in the front room of the Aster home on Earth... as we saw it in the video...

Outside, through an open window, they HEAR the shouts and laughter of children, the barking of a dog. A cat sleeps on the sofa. There's a grandfather clock.

JEREMY

It's my house. My house on Earth.

Marla ENTERS from the back of the house.

MARLA

Exactly the way it was... remember, Jeremy?

JEREMY

But how did you do it?

Marla smiles...

MARLA

Does it matter?

TROI

Yes. It matters.

She looks at Troi. Marla is very friendly --

MARLA

I am trying to understand your resistance. You spoke of rocks and dust on the planet? I decided to show what awaits us there.

TROI

Why would you create this fantasy?

MARLA

(can't you understand?)

It's his home.

(holding out a hand to

Jeremy)

And it makes you happy, doesn't it?

Jeremy is beyond words. Is she for real or not... He knows now, in his heart, she isn't... But it's so nice to be "home."

TROI

But it's not real.

MARLA

Isn't it? Jeremy, isn't that
really Patches?

Jeremy moves to the cat who looks up and meows at him... climbs into his arms. Jeremy reacts.

STAR TREK: "The Bonding" - REV. 8/25/89 - ACT FOUR 40.

43 CONTINUED: (2)

JEREMY

He knows me. It's him.

The cat was sleeping on a blanket on the sofa.

MARLA

Look -- your blanket...

Jeremy looks at it, touches it. It is his blanket. He reacts as the grandfather clock strikes a chime twice... clearly he recognizes the sound of the clock.

JEREMY

It's real. It's all real.

TROI

Jeremy, it's not. Could your real mother make all this appear?

He knows she could not, but he wants so much to believe.

TROI

(continuing)

You must not stay here.

Troi holds out her hand.

TROI

Come with me.

Jeremy looks at the Betazoid, at Marla, at the room. Shakes his head.

JEREMY

(very softly)

I can't.

TIME CUT TO:

43A INT. MAIN BRIDGE - CLOSE ON PICARD

PICARD

Is the boy in any danger?

TROI'S COM VOICE

I don't think so. She seems to want to help Jeremy.

STAR TREK: "The Bonding" - REV. 8/24/89 - ACT FOUR 40A.

43A CONTINUED:

And WIDEN to see Riker, Worf, Data, Beverly, Wesley and Geordi at their various stations.

PICARD

Help him?

INTERCUT:

44 OMITTED

44A INT. EARTH HOME (INTERCUT WITH SCENE 44B)

Troi off to the side... in the background, the mother doll and Jeremy are dangling a piece of string for the cat... playing with it...

TROI

MARLA

By easing his pain. She (background) seems very confused by Look at him. Look how our resistance, Captain. he tries to catch it...

JEREMY

(background) Maybe he thinks it's a mouse's tail.

PTCARD

Troi, would it be wise to remove Jeremy from his quarters?

TROI

He does not want to leave. I would not recommend taking him by force.

RIKER

She offers him everything. All we offer is the cold reality of his mother's death.

BEVERLY

What would you choose? If someone came along and offered to give you back your mother...

(toware Wesley)

... your father... (MORE)

BEVERLY (Cont'd)

... your... husband... would any of us say no so easily?

A beat. Picard sighs. To Troi --

PICARD

Remain in the cabin with them, Counselor. We're going to try to put an end to this from here...

TROI

Understood.

He signs off.

44B INT. MAIN BRIDGE

PICARD

Mister Data, can we determine for certain the energy source from the planet is powering this creation?

DATA

The beam from the planet is clearly tapping into the ship's anti-matter, Captain...

GEORDI

I'd say it's running the manifestation off our own energy.

PICARD

So there are limits to her power...

RIKER

(nods)

That's why she needs the Transporter to get the boy off the ship.

Picard pauses and considers.

PICARD

So how do we cut the puppet's strings?

GEORDI

By increasing the shield harmonics to match our antimatter containment fields, it is almost certain that the beam would be severed.

PICARD

Proceed.

RIKER

(to com)

Troi, stand by...

CUT TO:

44C thru OMITTED 45

46 INT. EARTH HOME (OPTICAL)

The fantasy is up and running. Marla and Jeremy are still seated with the cat... Troi moves to them...

TROI

Jeremy, it's time for this to end... You know it's not real and it is over now...

MARLA

I'm not going to leave you, Jeremy. Ever again.

Jeremy looks with hurt and confusion from one woman to the other.

TROI

Jeremy, I won't lie to you or trick you.

MARLA

Jeremy we'll be happy together as soon as...

She and the fantasy VANISH. Jeremy looks at the space where she was and knows that his mother and the wonderful dream is really gone. He says very softly,

JEREMY

No...

As Troi moves to comfort him...

CUT TO:

47 INT. MAIN BRIDGE

As before.

GEORDI

Anti-matter containment pods reading nominal...

DATA

The shields have severed the beam.

Data studies something on his console.

DATA

Captain, the energy field...

48 ANGLE ON VIEWSCREEN - (OPTICAL)

The ghost-like blanket has gathered into a glowing circular mass.

PICARD

Mister Crusher, take us out of...

Before he can finish...

- 49 OMITTED
- 50 EXT. SPACE THE ENTERPRISE (OPTICAL)

The energy form flashes across space and instantly penetrates the ship.

CUT TO:

51

thru OMITTED

52

53 INT. MAIN BRIDGE

The ship is rocked by the explosive arrival of the energy. Red alert begins to sound.

CUT TO:

53AA INT. CORRIDOR - NEAR TRANSPORTER ROOM (OPTICAL)

The energy mass move down the hallway and into

53A INT. TRANSPORTER ROOM - (OPTICAL)

O'Brien goggles at the glowing energy form which has appeared in the room. After a beat...

O'BRIEN

Alien intruder. Transporter Room Three. Security alert. Alien...

The form zaps at him, forcing him away from the console.

INTERCUT:

53B OMITTED

53C INT. MAIN BRIDGE

WORF

(to com)

Security to Transporter Room Three...

Picard on the move...

PICARD

Lieutenant Worf, Commander La Forge with me... Number One you have the Bridge.

53D INT. TRANSPORTER ROOM/CORRIDOR - (OPTICAL)

O'Brien is being driven out of the room by the force. Two security guards arrive. They are flung back. One of them fires his phaser, but it has no effect. The energy force zips back into the Transporter Room.

CUT TO:

53E INT. ASTER QUARTERS/EARTH HOME (OPTICAL)

Troi is comforting Jeremy when Marla and the Earth Home MATERIALIZE, and judging from the expression with which she favors Troi she is not happy.

She brushes past the Betazoid, moves to Jeremy and takes his hand. He's scared, confused...

MARLA

Come, Jeremy, we will not let them separate us again. We are going home.

Off Troi's reaction as we:

FADE OUT.

END OF ACT FOUR

ACT FIVE

FADE IN:

54

thru OMITTED

66

67 INT. TURBOLIFT

with Picard, Geordi and Worf... red alert sounding.

TROI'S COM VOICE

(urgently)

Captain, the image is back -- she's trying to take Jeremy off the ship again.

PICARD

(keys insignia)

Acknowledged.

GEORDI

(keys insignia)

Engineering, this is La Forge. Shut down power to all Transporters. I'm on my way...

PICARD

Lieutenant Worf, to Transporter Room Three.

They split up as they EXIT the Turbolift.

PICARD

(keys insignia)

Bridge, seal off deck eight, corridors A and B.

68 INT. MAIN BRIDGE

Data working the console...

DATA

Engaging force fields, Captain. Transporters are down.

69 INT. TRANSPORTER ROOM (OPTICAL)

The energy force is still there reacting as the power goes off, -- darting from component to component -- as Worf arrives, it bolts past him...

Worf checks on O'Brien and the security men who are okay.

WORF

Energy force has left Transporter Room Three... security alert, all decks...

69A INT. MAIN BRIDGE

RIKER

La Forge, the intruder may try to reinstate Transporter power.

GEORDI'S COM VOICE

Understood, Commander...

70 INT. CORRIDOR (OPTICAL)

Just outside Aster's quarters, Marla leads Jeremy out as Troi watches by the door. A force field is blocking the corridor. She turns to look in the another direction. Another force field at the other end of the hall is up and has them trapped.

71 ANGLE - PICARD (OPTICAL)

arrives at the forcefield... touches his insignia.

PICARD

Bridge, release security forcefield eight - B.

The forcefield in front of him disappears. For a moment, he and the alien Marla study each other.

PICARD

How are you, Jeremy? Are you frightened?

JEREMY

-- no.

(off his look)
A little, sir.

PICARD

Of course. These are frightening things that are happening. We won't let anyone harm you.

(off-handedly)

Counselor, why don't you take the child to my quarters.

Troi takes a step toward Jeremy. Marla puts her arm around Jeremy's shoulder. Tightly. Possessively.

MARLA

No.

Troi backs off. Ma leads him back into their quarters. Picard a?? Troi follow.

72 INT. ENGINEERING (OPTICAL)

Geordi follows the energy form as it moves from console to console...

GEORDI

(keys insignia)

It's looking over everything, Commander... going to school... Let's hope it doesn't blow us to Kingdom Come while it's figuring out how to blow us to Kingdom Come.

The energy zips into a console...

INTERCUT:

73 INT. TRANSPORTER ROOM

The power returns...

WORF

Power's back in Transporter Room Three...

73A INT. ENGINEERING

Geordi moves quickly to the controls...

GEORDI

By-passing to manual override... shutting it down...

73AB INT. TRANSPORTER ROOM

The Transporter goes down again.

WORF

Transporter is down again.

73A INT. MAIN BRIDGE

RIKER

Keep it down, Geordi... for as
long as you can...

74 INT. EARTH HOME (OPTICAL)

Picard, Troi, Jeremy and Marla.

MARLA

It is only a matter of time, Captain, before we can power the Transporters ourselves...

PICARD

We? For whom else do you speak?

Marla takes a beat to determine how much must be explained to these people... finally --

MARTIA

The accident on the surface was caused by a remnant of an old and tragic era. Two species once shared this world... one of energy... and one of matter. The physical beings you call the Koinonians destroyed themselves in unending, bitter wars. The surviving lifeforms on this world will not tolerate any further suffering from that dishonorable past. So they have made this possible... they have made me possible.

PICARD

I appreciate your motives. But his mother is dead. He must learn to live with that.

MARLA

I will be every bit his mother.

PICARD

But not his mother.

Jeremy watches them both... confused, trying to choose between what he wants and what is real. Picard's mind works... he keys his insignia...

PICARD

Picard to Lieutenant Worf.

WORF

Go ahead, Captain.

PICARD

Please escort Ensign Crusher to the Aster quarters. Picard out.

He exchanges a glance with Troi.

74 CONTINUED: (2)

MARLA

Your philosophy is curious, Captain. What is so noble about sorrow? I can provide him an existence where he will feel no pain, no anguish...

PICARD

It is at the heart of our very nature... to feel pain... and joy... that is what makes us what we are.

MARLA

He is alone now in your world. A child alone. How can you know he won't be happier with me?

Picard glances at Jeremy with compassion.

PICARD

For a brief moment in time... he surely would be. Any of us in his place would be.

TROI

What would Jeremy do for friends in your world?

Marla glances at Jeremy, considering this...

MARLA

He will have any friends he needs.

74 CONTINUED: (3)

TROI

And then will you provide for his education, his health, his growth? A career? A wife?

Marla considers all this... obviously for the first time.

PICARD

Yes, it is quite an undertaking you're proposing, isn't it?

MARLA

It is our duty to make him happy again.

PICARD

Do you honestly believe he will be happy in this total fiction you wish to create?

Off her look which is beginning to show doubt...

PTCARD

What will be his reason to live?

And she cannot answer that.

PICARD

What you offer is a memory... to cherish... but not to live in.

(beat)

It is part of our life cycle to accept the death of those we love. He must deal with grief, not cover it or hide from it. We are mortal. Our time in this universe is finite. It is the lesson every human must learn.

The door opens to reveal Worf and Wesley. Wesley is nervous, concerned.

WESLEY

Ensign Crusher reporting as ordered, sir.

PICARD

Come in, Wesley.

Worf begins to leave... casually --

74 CONTINUED: (4)

PICARD

... No, stay, Lieutenant.

Worf comes in and stands at attention in the background.

PICARD

Wesley lost his father on a Starfleet mission when he was even younger than you are.

Jeremy reacts. Marla looks at him with compassion.

TROI

Your mother told me you were finding it difficult to talk to Jeremy. Why?

WESLEY

I don't know. I guess... I just didn't want to think about it any more, you know... all this has reminded me so much of that day...

He shrugs, very uncomfortable. Troi glances at Picard... he moves toward Wesley. Playing a role --

PICARD

The day I told you your father had been killed.

Wesley acknowledges...

PICARD

As I recall, you handled the news very well.

WESLEY

My parents taught me about the dangers of starfleet missions. I knew it could happen.

PICARD

(probing)

So you were prepared.

WESLEY

(a beat, introspective)
No, I don't think I was. Not
really. How could anyone be...
prepared to hear that his dad
is... never coming home again.

74 CONTINUED: (5)

Picard acknowledges, of course. To Jeremy --

WESLEY

I just tried to be what everybody expected me to be. Brave.
Mature.

PICARD

Are you saying you didn't want anybody to see how you really felt, Wesley?

And Wesley looks down as the memories sweep across him... he looks down, nods. Softly --

PICARD

So how did you really feel?

WESLEY

(whispers)

Like somebody kicked me right in the brain.

PICARD

(gently)

Somebody?

Wesley shrugs. Doesn't look at Picard.

TROI

Go ahead, Wesley. You've wanted to tell him for a long time...

He looks up at Picard with a tear in his eye.

WESLEY

I was angry.

(long beat)

At you.

Of course, Picard knows this... but it's important for them as well as Jeremy to get it all out now...

PICARD

Why, Wesley? Why were you angry with me?

Wesley backs away from the feelings... he's gone as far as he's comfortable... he shrugs... but that's not enough...

74 CONTINUED: (6)

PICARD

Were you angry because I was the one who told you he was dead?

WESLEY

(pause)

No.

PICARD

Then why?

Softly, painfully, outloud for the first time...

WESLEY

Because you led the mission. You came back. My father didn't.

Picard acknowledges... moves away as Troi moves in with great compassion...

TROI

How long were you angry with Captain Picard, Wesley?

WESLEY

A long time.

(turns to Picard)
But not any more. Not even a little, sir.

WORF

She was my responsibility.

TROI

He can't answer that, Jeremy. (to Marla)

None of us can.

PICARD

Lieutenant Worf also lost his parents, Jeremy.

Jeremy reacts.

WORF

(to Jeremy)

He and Worf look at each other. The bonding has begun. Worf glances at Picard and Troi. Troi nods... Worf moves toward the boy.

WORF

When I was alone, humans helped me. Let me help you.

Marla and Picard regard each other for a long moment. She understands she is no longer needed. She nods to Picard. She lowers her head. She disappears. The room goes back to normal -- the Aster quarters.
