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COLD OPEN

FADE IN:

1 <u>INT. FOX SPORTS - LOBBY/ELEVATOR/HALLWAY - DAY</u> (MITCH, TERRY, RECEPTIONIST)

1

MITCH ENTERS THE BRIGHT AND EXCITING LOBBY. HE'S AWESTRUCK BY THE SUPERSTARS, TROPHY CASES, AND TV SCREENS. HE SURREPTITIOUSLY TAKES A SELFIE. IT'S A PINCH ME MOMENT. HE LOOKS AT IT, SHAKES HEAD, DELETES IT, TRIES AGAIN, LOOKS, DELETES IT AND SHAKES HEAD. HE TAKES A BREATH AND THEN, SUMMONING CONFIDENCE FROM DEEP, STEPS TO THE SECURITY DESK.

MITCH

Hi, I'm Mitch Berry and I'm starting work here today.

THE RECEPTIONIST LOOKS FOR HIS NAME. HE CAN SEE HIS NAME ON THE SHEET BUT DOESN'T WANT TO POINT.

MITCH (CONT'D) (awkward, as she looks)

I only got the job Friday afternoon.

So weird. Mitch Berry. I was just sitting in my cubicle selling insurance and FOX Sports calls and offers me - Mitch Berry, third column - my dream job running and starring on a fantasy football show. Next thing you know I'm here in LA and Mitch Berry - third column, fourth down - is being paid to do what he loves - talk fantasy football under the given name Mitch, surname Berry.

RECEPTIONIST

I'm sorry, you're confusing me. Just give me your full name.

TERRY (O.S.)

Mitch Berry!

TERRY (FEMALE, 40'S, ATTRACTIVE, BOLD WITH PINPOINT FOCUS, PRAGMATIC, UNAPOLOGETICALLY CAUSTIC, AND APOLOGETICALLY COMPASSIONATE) APPROACHES.

TERRY (CONT'D)

Terry Wilson, Senior VP programming. We're excited to have you on board. Your videos and podcasts are really impressive. You really know your stuff.

MITCH

Thanks. I try to--

TERRY

--Exactly. Walk fast. The show
starts in five days and we're way
behind. We don't have a title sponsor
and our graphics look like a My Little
Pony commercial.
(then, pointing)

Let's cut through here.

2 <u>INT. FOX FOOTBALL STUDIO/BACKSTAGE/CONTROL ROOM - CONTINUOUS</u> (MITCH, TERRY, HOST, CHUCK)

MITCH AND TERRY CUT ACROSS THE FAKE FOOTBALL FIELD IN THE FOX FOOTBALL STUDIO. MITCH IS BLOWN AWAY.

MITCH

(wide eyed)

Wow!

AS TERRY AND MITCH CROSS, REVEAL A HOST, JIM (AFRICAN AMERICAN, 30'S) DOING A 'STAND AND TALK' TO CAMERA. USE POV OF FOX FOOTBALL STUDIO CAMERA.

JIM

And, then we move over to the east

where the Falcons and Titans meet up--

TERRY

Jim, fix your tie. You look like an

insurance salesman.
 (to Mitch)

No offense.

MTTCH

(fixing hair)

Were we just on TV?

THEY ROUND A CORNER AND, THERE STANDING IN FRONT OF THEM, IS THE LEGENDARY, PLAYER/COACH CHUCK BYRNE (LATE 50'S, TOUGH).

TERRY

Mitch, this is--

MITCH

(in complete awe)

Chuck Byrne! Wow!

(collecting himself)

My dad and I were your biggest fans.

CHUCK

Men who cheer for men are ladies.

MITCH

Totally.

TERRY

I just added Chuck to the Fox Football

broadcast. Chuck, meet Mitch Berry,

FOX Sports' new fantasy guy.

CHUCK

(looking him over)

I think we can do better.

МТТСН

Fantasy football.

CHUCK

Fantasy football?! Next thing you

know golf will be a sport.

МТТСН

(laughs, trying to joke back)

And, fencing!

CHUCK GIVES HIM A STERN, JUDGING LOOK.

CHUCK

I love fencing.

MITCH

You know they have fantasy fencing,

you should try- (off Chuck's stare)

Again, great meeting you.

THEY LEAVE CHUCK AND MOVE TO THE DOOR OF THE CONTROL ROOM.

TERRY

Mitch, last week, our network chairman looked at a boardroom full of people and explained how much money fantasy football makes, and asked why we were the only network without a fantasy football show. I stepped up and told him I'd start a show right away. I did that because I have a long track record of succeeding. Failure's just never been an option for me. I'm telling you this because you're the key component in my recipe for 'not failing.' And, so I need you to do me a 'solid' and not let me down. Can you do me that solid?

MITCH

I think I can.

TERRY

I'm going to need you to do better than that.

MITCH

I'm sure I can.

TERRY

(still not fully satisfied
 with the answer)

Okay, almost there. (then)

Let's move.

SHE LEADS HIM INTO THE CONTROL ROOM.

3 <u>INT. FOX SPORTS - HALLWAY/CONTROL ROOM</u> (MITCH, TERRY, ABBY)

3

THEY POP INTO THE CONTROL ROOM. A MUTED MITCH IS ON SCREEN.

TERRY

Oh look, there you are on the big screen. We've been using temp footage from your podcast to test out the graphics. See what I mean about the My Little Pony commercial?

TERRY HITS A KNOB ON THE PODCAST THAT MADE MITCH A FANTASY FOOTBALL GURU. THE GRAPHICS ARE OVER-THE-TOP AND ODDLY-ANIMATED. THE CONTENT OF MITCH'S PODCAST IS EXCELLENT.

MITCH

(on screen)

Remember, Over the last five weeks, no team in the NFL has given up more yards after contact than the Houston Texans, making Chris Ivory a solid number two running back this week--

TERRY

This is what I want from you on the show. Focused, smart, almost Rain Manesque commentary.

(then)

Okay, here is your team starting with your host...

PLAYS A CLIP FEATURING SUMMER DALE (MID 20'S, HOT).

SUMMER

(on the monitor)

Hi and welcome to FOX Fantasy, we've got a big show for you--

MITCH

Summer Dale.

TERRY

She's one of our network president's top three most talented daughters. (then)

Summer is like an iPhone you dropped in water. When the light comes on you're happier than ever - even if there's a lot of data missing.

TERRY CUES UP A NEW CLIP.

TERRY (CONT'D)

This is one of your analysts, Michael Coleman the second.

PLAYS CLIP OF MICHAEL COLEMAN II AKA MC2 (30'S, AFRICAN AMERICAN, THINK CUBA GOODING JR.).

MITCH

MC2. Career 4.9 Yards per carry, 6 time Pro Bowler, team rushing record--

TERRY

Never won a Super Bowl.

MITCH

But, still, an amazing player.

TERRY

An amazing player wins. You see what I'm getting at here? To me, anything short of a win is a failure. Growing up, my dad had a saying: "Win." He was a man of few words but that piece of advice always resonated with me and my five brothers. And, that's why I'm at this point. I like to win. And, I'm hoping that same sentiment propels you over the next five days.

ABBY TANNER (MID 20'S, STRONG, CONFIDENT) ENTERS THE CONTROL ROOM WEARING AN EAGLES T-SHIRT.

ABBY

(to whole control room)

Hit 'em low, hit 'em high, and watch our Eagles fly, fly, fly! Did somebody in this room bet that the Patriots would beat the Eagles? Never root against the city of brotherly love, friends!

ABBY HANDS OUT EAGLES JERSEYS.

ABBY (CONT'D)

Wear them for the entire day in good health and profound shame.

THEY ALL START PUTTING THEM ON. ABBY EXITS.

TERRY

(to Mitch)

That's Abby Tanner.

(MORE)

TERRY (CONT'D)

Your other analyst. Can you tell she's from Philly?

MITCH

(he knows her background)

Born and raised but spent time at the FOX affiliate in Boston before--

TERRY

Mitch, you already have the job.

Let's go meet your team.

4 <u>INT. FOX SPORTS - BOARDROOM - CONTINUOUS</u> (TERRY, MITCH, ABBY, MC2, SUMMER)

4

MITCH AND TERRY ENTER. IN THE ROOM ARE MC2, ABBY (WHO IS JUST ARRIVING), AND SUMMER.

TERRY

Everyone, I'd like to introduce your new boss, the man who will put us on the fantasy football map, Mitch Berry. Mitch, tell them about yourself.

MITCH

Okay, well, um... I've been playing fantasy football for years and, you know, I really enjoy it.

TERRY

Come on, buddy. Reassure me that I made the right decision.

MITCH

Um, I have a popular blog, three million Twitter followers, one of the top podcasts on iTunes.

TERRY

Okay, now I feel good.

ABBY

Where were you working before this?--

MC2

(on ipad)

Dude, I just looked you up. You ranked me seventh three years in a row.

SUMMER

--I just tweeted you got the job and now all sorts of nerds are sending me messages. Can you tell your followers to ease up on the 'junk' mail?

MITCH

Okay, I'll address these in order. (to Abby)

Abby I'm from the insurance industry.

But I also ran a network of 20

freelance writers for my blog while

doing a podcast, YouTube series and

writing a column. Fox is different

than a blog but this is my passion

and, if I've learned one thing in

insurance, it's to never underestimate-

MITCH PAUSES, WAITING FOR A LAUGH. NOTHING.

MITCH (CONT'D)

Sorry. Bad insurance joke. (then, doubling down)

Maybe I need to make an adjustment.

NO ONE RESPONDS.

MITCH (CONT'D)

That used to kill.

FLASH TO:

5 <u>INT. INSURANCE COMPANY - DAY</u> (MITCH, DRU, OTHER PEOPLE)

5

6

MITCH IS TALKING TO A GROUP OF PEOPLE IN THE INSURANCE OFFICE.

MITCH

And, so I said to him, maybe you need to make an adjustment.

EVERYONE DIES OF LAUGHTER.

FLASH BACK TO:

6 <u>INT. FOX SPORTS - BOARDROOM - CONTINUOUS</u> (TERRY, MITCH, ABBY, MC2, SUMMER)

MITCH

In all seriousness, MC2, um, you were a great player but you were injured a lot and you never had, you know, double digit touchdowns in a season and, well... you have small hands.

MC2

(then, looking at his hands)

I prefer to think of my hands as half-full.

MITCH

And, Summer, I will definitely tell my followers to stop sending you graphic pictures of their privates.

SUMMER

I just said 'ease up.'

MITCH

I guess I'm just asking you to trust
me for a short while --

TERRY

That's an order.

MTTCH

--Because nothing in the world is as important to me as this job. You've taken my fantasy and made it a reality and I thank you for that.

THEY LOOK AT MITCH, UNSURE.

TERRY

Corny but true. I need everyone listening to this guy. Okay, let's get back to work.

(laughing, to Mitch)

'Taken my fantasy and turned it into a reality?' Wow! For a second I thought I hired a Disney princess.

7 <u>INT. FOX SPORTS - MITCH'S OFFICE - MOMENTS LATER</u> (MITCH, TERRY, MAX, CHUCK)

MITCH AND TERRY ENTER MITCH'S OFFICE. IT'S BIG AND IMPRESSIVE. MAX (25, NERDY) IS SITTING AT MITCH'S DESK.

TERRY

So, this is your office. You can put down your...
(looking in box)

Plain white mug and Tide Stick in here.

MAX

Mitch Berry! I can't believe I'm meeting you!

TERRY

Mitch, meet our IT guy...
 (guessing)

Tom Davis?

MAX

Max Allen. I was your 43rd Twitter follower. You might know me by my handle "at max on, max off."

(then)

I know this might be a little early, but I've taken the liberty of placing a clickable hotlink to my Linkedin on your task bar. If you ever need a personal assistant, I could easily become the Samwise to your Frodo, Peeta to your Katniss. Max to your Mitch. M& M? Nope? Too aggressive. Mom was right.

TERRY

You see, Mitch, this is why we're doing a fantasy football show. You've got a committed audience when hobbies replace sex.

MITCH

That's the stereotype but the truth is everyone plays. Demographic research shows the playing audience is actually a very wide range. Even Jay Z plays. He's got 99 problems but a QB ain't one.

MITCH HATES THE JOKE. MAX LAUGHS WAY TOO HARD AT IT. TERRY SMILES.

MAX

That's great. Hilarious!

MITCH

I guess, what I'm saying is fantasy football isn't just for nerds.

MAX

My team is called "Luke, I am your punter."

MAX HAS A JERSEY CUSTOM-MADE FOR HIS TEAM. THEY GLARE AT HIM. MITCH SIGHS.

MITCH

(upbeat)

But, yes, nerds also play.

MITCH GETS ON THE ELEVATOR. MC2 IS ON IT WITH A CART OF MC2 MERCHANDISE. HE'S WEARING A SHIRT WITH THE CAPTION 'ME=MC2'.

MITCH

Oh, hey man! I got all your texts apologizing for asking about being picked seventh.

MC2

So sorry, I get insecure about my work.

MITCH

You get insecure?! I'm an outsider trying to fit in with world-class athletes and big time broadcasters!

MC2

We've all been outsiders. I grew up in an all-white neighborhood in Connecticut. You've just got to figure out a way to fit in.

FLASH BACK TO:

9 <u>INT. MC2'S HIGH SCHOOL - DAY</u> (MC2, WHITE KID, DORKY WHITE KID) 9

SHOT OF A FLYER BEING TAPED TO A WALL, READING "HANG OUT WITH A BLACK GUY. \$20 AN HOUR." PULL BACK TO REVEAL A YOUNG MC2. TWO DIFFERENT KIDS ARE STANDING THERE.

WHITE KID

Hey man, do you have two hours on the 5th?

MC2

I can do four to six but I have a hard out at six-thirty.

DORKY WHITE KID

What if I wanted you to come to a bat mitzvah?

MC2

Take a seat, Berkowitz. Let's talk numbers.

FLASH TO:

10 <u>INT. FOX SPORTS - ELEVATOR - CONTINUOUS</u> (MITCH, MC2)

10

MITCH

I would have been your first customer.

MC2

Haha! This is gonna be great. We're going to be buds. I can feel it. No charge.

MITCH

(re: promo items, joking)

You having a yard sale?

MC2

(genuinely laughing)

Oh my God, you're nuts! (then, serious)

But, seriously, I only endorse things
I truly believe in.

MITCH

Is that a Salad Spinner?

REVEAL A SALAD SPINNER WITH MC2'S FACE ON IT.

MC2

Hey, let me ask you this, do you think it would be cool if I maybe brought some of these products on the show?

You know, get a little exposure.

MITCH

If it doesn't affect the content, I can't see how it would hurt.

MC2

Cool, man! Have a Powerale. It's an energy drink that's also a beer.

MITCH

Thanks. I'll drink this whenever I want to get drunk and fight a tiger.

MC2

(genuinely laughing again)

Is this Steve Harvey I'm looking at?
Get this man a purple suit. Wow, man,
you're a clown.
 (then)

Not in a bad way. A lovable clown.

Like Bozo or the guy who owns

McDonald's.

MITCH

Cool, bro-- man- (exiting, to self)

I need more black friends.

MC2

(overhearing, calling after)

I've got a short window from 5:30-6.

11 <u>INT. FOX SPORTS - LOBBY - CONTINUOUS</u> (MITCH, TERRY)

11

MITCH GETS OFF THE ELEVATOR AND STARTS WALKING DOWN THE HALLWAY. TERRY APPROACHES.

TERRY

Mitch, I have some good news! I've secured a title sponsor for the show. It's a restaurant chain called Cha Cha's. The sales department describes them as a less-stuffy Hooters. Here's their info.

TERRY HANDS OVER A BROCHURE, WHICH IS ENTIRELY BLURRED OUT BECAUSE OF ITS RACY PHOTOS.

MITCH

Whoa. I'm on my way to a show

meeting. I'll tell everyone about--

TERRY

(re: TV monitor behind Mitch)

Shh. Shh.

TERRY TURNS UP THE VOLUME ON THE FOX FOOTBALL BROADCAST.

TERRY (CONT'D)

I've been hearing that Chuck's not fitting in. Which is odd because I very rarely make mistakes.

12 <u>INT. FOX FOOTBALL STUDIO - DAY</u> (CHUCK, JIM)

12

JIM

Chuck, you played an entire game with a broken bone sticking out of your thigh, what do you think of Gronkowski sitting out today with the flu?

CHUCK

I didn't realize having the sniffles made your nuts shrink.

NERVOUS LAUGHTER FROM JIM.

JIM

I'm sure he'll be happy to hear that.
 (then, continuing)

Aaron Rodgers just signed a deal worth 22 Million dollars.

CHUCK

22 million?! For what? To be protected by linemen? For all the flack Michael Sam got for being the only guy in the league who played for the wrong team, about how he was a little light in the cleats, at least he was tough.

(MORE)

13

CHUCK (CONT'D)

Sure I wouldn't want that bone collector taking a snap from me, if you know what I mean, but-MORE NERVOUS LAUGHTER. TERRY TURNS IT OFF.

TERRY

I may have made a mistake.

13 <u>INT. BOARDROOM - DAY</u> (MITCH, MC2, ABBY, SUMMER, CHUCK)

MITCH ENTERS THE BOARDROOM. THE GANG IS THERE.

MITCH

Our new sponsor, Cha Cha's, has sent us their wardrobe guidelines, promotional requirements, that sort of thing.

ABBY

Wardrobe guidelines? (grabs sheet and reads)

Mitch, it says women should wear 'clothing that is reflective of the Cha Cha's brand' which they describe as 'urban escort.' I'm not dressing like one of MC2's girlfriends.

MITCH

And, no one expects you to. (to MC2)

I'm not saying your girlfriend or girlfriends dress inappropriately.

MC2

It's cool. They do.

SUMMER

I used to work at Cha Cha's. They may seem wild but they watch out for the girls. Watch you close. I mean, even the dressing rooms had cameras.

ABBY

You used to work there? Your dad is president of the network?!

SUMMER

I want to be a self-made woman.

That's why I auditioned for this job.

I got it on my own merit, right guys?

ALL

Totally/For sure/Definitely.

MC2

Wait, if there's a title sponsor, does that affect my ability to work in plugs for my products?

MITCH

Yeah, I guess it does.

ABBY

It says here 'the breast must be visible from all angles.' The nipple can be obstructed.

SUMMER

See? They look out for you.

ABBY

Mitch, what's the deal?

MC2

Dude, come on you've got to fix this.

Remember the laughs we had on the elevator?

MITCH

Everyone relax. It's all going to be okay.

CHUCK ENTERS.

CHUCK

Is this the fake sports department?

I've been added to your team.

END ACT ONE

ACT TWO

14 <u>INT. FOX SPORTS - LOBBY/ELEVATOR - DAY</u> (MITCH, MAX, ABBY, TERRY)

14

MITCH IS WALKING IN TO WORK THE NEXT DAY. MAX IS THERE, PRETENDING TO DO SOMETHING BUT REALLY JUST WAITING FOR MITCH.

MAX

So, you freaking out about that guy, Chuck Byrne? If you want, I can put some weird shit on his computer, get him fired. And, kept away from schools.

MITCH

I think it's great he's on the team.

MAX

Ugh. So what if he played 20 years in the NFL without missing a game because of injury. Or, that he has two purple hearts. Doesn't impress me. Pick up a third-string running back off waivers three minutes before game time and have him rush for 200 yards. Then I'm impressed.

MITCH

You know, no game he played or coached was ever rained on? People said that 'rain' was afraid of him.

MAX

It's all BS. It's not real. <u>Fantasy</u> is real.

TERRY, WHO IS TALKING TO SOMEONE, SEES MITCH AND LEAVES THE PERSON WHILE THEY'RE IN MID SENTENCE.

TERRY

Mitch.

TERRY JOINS MITCH (AND MAX). THEY GET ON THE ELEVATOR.

TERRY (CONT'D)

Give me a quick update. Where are we at? You excited about Chuck?

MAX

No--

MITCH (cuts off Max)

I think it's going as well as can--

JUST THEN, ABBY RUNS AND GETS ON TOO. SHE'S WEARING FRUMPY CLOTHING, AND IS NOT MADE UP.

TERRY

You doing radio today?

ABBY

(trying to be casual/tough)

This is my outfit for the show! It shouldn't matter what I look like. The quality of my work is all that should be relevant to the viewer.

THE DOORS OPEN AND ABBY STORMS OUT, TERRY AND MITCH FOLLOW.

MITCH

I'm brand new, and I assume I have very little clout--

TERRY

None.

MITCH

--but, I'd appreciate it if you could let Abby dress like... well, you.

TERRY

I appreciate the compliment but, Cha Cha's was the only company interested in sponsoring the show. With no sponsor, there's no show. With no show, there's no Mitch. With no Mitch, there very well might be no Terry. And, that's the one I care about.

(then)

Is this too much for you, State Farm?

MITCH

I've got it under control. You hired me to do a job and I can do it.

15 <u>INT. FOX SPORTS - MITCH'S OFFICE - D2</u> (CHUCK, MITCH)

15

MITCH ENTERS HIS OFFICE. SURPRISINGLY, CHUCK IS THERE.

MITCH

Oh, hey--

CHUCK

Thanks for moving out for me. You left a plain, white mug and a Tide Stick here, so I put them over there.

CHUCK POINTS TO THE GARBAGE.

MITCH

I didn't--

(off Chuck's stern look)

--want you to feel unwelcome.

MAX ENTERS, HOLDING A COMPUTER, WHICH HE PLUGS INTO THE FULL WALL OF TVS. HE SEES CHUCK SITTING AT MITCH'S DESK.

MAX

Hop out. That's Mitch's chair--

MITCH

(to Max)

Max, have you loaded up the document I sent you last night?

MAX

Does the Sarlacc have fifteen rows of razor sharp teeth?

MTTCH

Do you have some time for a tutorial on fantasy football, Chuck?

CHUCK

Mitch, my father was 'Chuck'. I'm Mr. Byrne. And, I only have ten minutes.

I'm doing a charity thing called

'Parts for Hearts'.

(MORE)

CHUCK (CONT'D)

Everyone builds a part of a car, and then they put it all together and sell it to a wealthy jackass who won't drive it. My buddy and I are building a carburetor.

MAX

You mean 'rebuilding' a carburetor.

CHUCK

No, son. I mean building. Rebuilding means another man has already done the real work.

MITCH

Okay, here goes.

MITCH HITS THE SPACE BAR ON HIS COMPUTER. A GRAPHIC BEFITTING A HIGH BUDGET ACTION MOVIE COMES ON THE SCREEN. IT SAYS, 'THE BERRY BEST: A FANTASY FOOTBALL GUIDE.

MITCH (CONT'D)

What's this?

MAX

I took the opportunity to spruce it up a little. Trying to prove that I would be an asset to the team.

MITCH

Well, thanks--

MITCH HITS THE SPACE BAR. WITH MORE EXPLOSIONS AND HIGH INTENSITY GRAPHICS, THE CONTENT IS NOW MORE EXCITING. MAX IS MOUTHING ALONG TO WHAT MITCH IS SAYING ON SCREEN.

MITCH (CONT'D)

Fantasy football is a game played between a group of twelve people.

HE HITS THE SPACE BAR AGAIN. THE SONG, 'Y'ALL READY FOR THIS' STARTS. TWELVE PLAYERS COME ON SCREEN BUT FREEZE.

MAX

Shoot, I crashed the system. (then, running out)

I've got to reboot.

MITCH PULLS OUT A MARKER, STARTS WRITING ON THE WHITE BOARD.

MITCH

Okay, here's how it works. Fantasy football is an internet-based competition in which users compete against each other--

CHUCK

I'm sorry. I heard the words internet and football next to each other, and something inside me died. I played real football. Suffered real pain. Got hit so hard I lost control of my real bowels.

MITCH

Cool. I'll start over then. Fantasy football is--

JUST THEN, A RACE CAR DRIVER COMES TO THE DOOR.

RACE CAR DRIVER

Chuck, you ready to build that carburetor?

CHUCK

Sorry, Mitch, I've got to go.

MITCH LOOKS DEJECTED AS CHUCK LEAVES.

16 <u>INT. FOX SPORTS COMMISSARY - MOMENTS LATER</u> (MITCH, ABBY, DALLAS COWBOYS CHEERLEADERS)

16

MITCH IS GETTING LUNCH IN THE COMMISSARY. HE'S IN LINE SERVING HIMSELF FROM THE ROW OF FRIDGES. ABBY COMES UP NEXT TO HIM. THEY SLIDE THEIR TRAYS ALONG.

ABBY

Hey, Mitch. Before our rehearsal, I just want to talk to you about the wardrobe issue.

ABBY (CONT'D)

It's tough enough to be a woman in

sports as is. (deep voice)

"You never played the game, girlie." (then, normal)

And having to wear an outfit that shows off my legs and breasts only undermines that hard to earn credibility.

MITCH (trying to keep it quiet)

Yes, totally, but there's also a time and a place where it could feasibly--

ABBY

--I worked my way up. I have a brain.

I'm not some empty headed Barbie with

no life skills and low self esteem

that the only thing I can do is jiggle

my breasts around on live TV
 (turning to get a dessert,
 noticing cheerleaders,
 playing it off)

I love your hair.
 (then, sotto back to Mitch)

Now that I have my shot, I want to succeed or fail on my talent, not my looks.

SHE WALKS OFF WITH HER FOOD LEAVING MITCH WITH THE CHEERLEADERS.

MITCH (in Cheerleader rhythm)

Can you give me a D...ssert. (then, hating his joke)

Sorry. I'll just pop out.

17 <u>INT. FOX SPORTS - STUDIO - MOMENTS LATER</u> (MITCH, MC2, SUMMER)

17

MITCH WALKS INTO THE FOX FANTASY STUDIO, HOLDING HIS FOOD. MC2 AND SUMMER ARE ALREADY THERE. SUMMER (WITH SKIMPY CLOTHING) IS SITTING AT THE FOX FANTASY DESK, HOLDING A CAN OF MC2'S POWERALE, READING COPY OFF A TELEPROMPTER.

SUMMER

Welcome to Fox Fantasy, brought to you

by Cha Cha's...

(then, louder and more
powerful)

MC2

(pulling out Powerale)

Did somebody say Powerale?

MTTCH

Hey guys! I'm not sure that this is going to work.

MC2

(opens Mitch's lunch)

Hey, man, mind if I have a fry?

THROUGH THE REST OF THE SCENE, MC2 EATS HIS FRIES.

MC2 (CONT'D)

I figured if I wasn't allowed to promote my energy beer, I'd try to slip it in.

MITCH

Sorry, man. It's a no go.

MC2

But, this is why I took the gig. It isn't for the money. They're only paying me \$3.8 Million a year. No one can survive on that. As it is, I can barely afford to feed my giraffes. (then, almost emotional)

No. I took it for a deeper, more noble reason..
(then, normal again)

...To tap into the market share that 35 million fantasy football players, most of whom are 18-34 with an average income of \$87,000 a year, deliver.

SUMMER STARTS EATING MITCH'S FRIES, TOO.

SUMMER

If you want me to talk to the Cha Cha's people I will. Some of the girls mentioned they had a special trick that helped them get what they wanted from the bosses.

MITCH

My hands are tied.

SUMMER

Yeah, that was part of the trick.

MC2

Mitch, come on! You've got to stand up to Terry.

MITCH

I'm sorry.

MC2 AND SUMMER GRAB HANDFULS OF FRIES AND WALK OFF, UPSET.
MITCH STANDS FOR A BEAT. HE GETS A TEXT. WE SEE THE TEXT IS
FROM MC2 AND IT JUST SAYS, "SORRY. YOU'RE STILL MY BOY."

18 <u>INT. FOX SPORTS - HALL OF FAME ROOM - MOMENTS LATER</u> 18 (MITCH, CHUCK)

MITCH ENTERS TO FIND CHUCK SITTING ON A BENCH LOOKING AT A DISPLAY OF AN OLD UNIFORM.

MITCH

A FEW REFEREES TRY TO PULL A PLAYER'S LEG OUT OF CHUCK'S HELMET.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)

And, it looks like the refs are trying to corkscrew the cleat out of Chuck's head! It appears Chuck is smiling.

FLASH BACK TO:

20 <u>INT. FOX SPORTS - HALL OF FAME ROOM - CONTINUOUS</u> (MITCH, CHUCK)

2.0

CHUCK

Mitch, the way I see it, football is a sport played by a team. I see fantasy as a fake game played by one sad man on his computer. That's not a team.

MITCH

My dad had similar... irritations.

21 <u>INT. MITCH'S CHIDHOOD HOME - DAY</u> (7 YEAR-OLD MITCH, MITCH'S DAD)

21

A SEVEN YEAR-OLD MITCH IS SITTING IN FRONT OF THE TV WITH A BUNCH OF PAPERS, PENS AND A REALLY OLD COMPUTER.

MITCH'S DAD

Mitch, turn off that computer. You can crunch numbers all day but the thing you need to realize is that if you're not getting your head mashed in by eleven 300 pound men running directly at you with the force of a Mack truck, you're not playing. Now, crunch the numbers on getting me a new Bud Light?

CHUCK

MITCH

MAX

(almost emotional)

I'm just so happy to be one of Mitch
Berry's picks.
 (then to gang)

I feel so--

MITCH

Okay, people, let's all head to the studio. This is our last rehearsal before the show.

ABBY (O.C.)

What the hell!

MITCH LOOKS TO SEE THE COMMOTION. ABBY IS HOLDING A VERY SKIMPY, ALMOST NON-EXISTENT OUTFIT.

ABBY (CONT'D)

This is wrong! Just wrong!

SUMMER

It so is! Why do you get to wear such a cute outfit?

ABBY

Would you please excuse me for a sec?

COLLECTED, SHE WALKS INTO THE ELEVATOR. THE DOORS CLOSE.

ABBY (O.S.) (CONT'D)

Aaaaaarrrrrgghhh!

AFTER A FEW BEATS, THE ELEVATOR DOORS OPEN AND ABBY, FULLY COLLECTED, POPS HER HEAD OUT.

ABBY (CONT'D)

Mitch, can I see you for a second?

MITCH WALKS OVER AND GETS ON THE ELEVATOR WITH ABBY. GARY FROM THE CONTROL ROOM IS ON THE ELEVATOR. SHE PULLS THE STOP BUTTON. HE LOOKS SCARED.

ABBY (CONT'D)

(to Gary)

Gary, this'll just take a second. I'm upset so I might go full Philly on you here.

(MORE)

ABBY (CONT'D) (then, in Philly accent)

Oi'm not wearing dis outfit. Oi'm not sure if dis means oi'm fired but oi'm not doing dat. Oi'm taking a stand.

26 <u>INT. FOX SPORTS - BULLPEN - NIGHT</u> (ABBY, TERRY)

26

ABBY EXITS AN EDITING SUITE AND WALKS PAST TERRY'S OFFICE.

TERRY

Abby, can you pop in for a second?

ABBY

Terry.

TERRY

Have a seat.

ABBY

Are you watching Say Yes to The Dress?

TERRY

No. The remote's broken. (smiles, changes subject)

Look, about the wardrobe issue, I

don't like it any more than you do but

we can't do the show without a sponsor

and Cha's is all we have.

ABBY

So, you understand my frustration.

TERRY

Of course. No one understands it better. But, we differ on ways to fix it. I've always believed that you're not going to affect real change unless you're at the top.

(MORE)

TERRY (CONT'D)

And, in this business you're not going to get to the top unless you're twice as tough and good as any man. And, you have to play the game.

ABBY

But, that shouldn't be.

TERRY

Of course it shouldn't be. I've been dealing with this glass ceiling since it was made of corrugated metal. I've always been the only female. At director level. At VP level. At SVP level. ABBY

Hey. I should apologize for earlier.

MITCH

For what?

ABBY

For losing my cool on the elevator.

MITCH

If it weren't for the screaming, the fist pounding and the abrupt sound of the elevator screeching to a halt, I wouldn't even have noticed.

ABBY SMILES.

ABBY

I've just worked so hard to get here,
that I want to be taken seriously.

MITCH PICKS UP THE HORRIBLY REVEALING PAIR OF SHORTS.

MITCH

(jokingly)

And, so you feel this won't help you

be taken seriously?
 (reading label)

I mean, it's from The Tart Mart.

ABBY

(pointing to the label)

If you look on the label, it actually warns you that the shorts aren't edible.

MITCH AND ABBY LAUGH. THE LIGHTS GO OUT.

ABBY (CONT'D)

Oh, shoot. The lights in here are on sensors. When they go off, you need to do this.

SHE WAVES HER ARMS IN THE AIR. MITCH JOINS IN. THEY LAUGH.

ABBY (CONT'D)

Ever since I started working here, people only look at my breasts.

MITCH ACTIVELY SHOOTS HIS GLARE UP TO HER FOREHEAD.

MITCH

That's gotta suck.

ABBY

You don't have to look at my forehead.

HE OVERCOMPENSATES AND STARTS LOOKING AT HER BREASTS.

ABBY (CONT'D)

That's not an invitation to look at my breasts.

MITCH LOOKS HER IN THE EYE, LAUGHS.

MITCH

(laughing)

I don't know where to look!

ABBY LAUGHS, PULLS OUT A FEW POWERALES FROM MC2'S DESK.

ABBY

Powerale?

MITCH ACCEPTS. THEY BOTH TAKE A SIP AND RECOIL.

ABBY (CONT'D)

Mitch, I see myself out there on the big broadcast on Sunday's, but, as I just told Terry, I'm not gonna cheapen myself to do it.

MITCH

You're passionate. I get that. I spent my life dreaming about a job like this. And, I want to do it properly, too. This is my only shot to do fantasy football, full time, which I've always felt was my destiny.

29 <u>INT. FOX SPORTS - BULLPEN - NIGHT - CONTINUOUS</u> (MITCH, ABBY)

29

MITCH

I'm a recovering nerd.

ABBY SMILES, TAKES A SIP, LETS OUT A HUGE BURP.

ABBY

Wow! This stuff is strong!

MITCH

Are your teeth vibrating?

THE LIGHTS GO OUT AGAIN. THEY SHAKE THEIR ARMS. THE LIGHTS COME BACK ON.

ABBY

Mitch, in fantasy, you're known for seeing stats and matchups that no one else sees. Why are you so stumped on how to solve these problems? You, more than anyone know how to make teams work. Sure, they're fake teams, but they're still a group of people with individual strengths and weaknesses. This is a matchup. What is no one else seeing?

MITCH

(lightbulb)

You're right.

ABBY AND MITCH SHARE A SMILE.

ABBY

I'm going to go. In the eventuality

that I have to be on TV tomorrow, I

want to be sharp.

AS SHE GETS UP, SHE KNOCKS THE BEER OUT OF HIS HAND WHILE HE'S TAKING A SIP.

ABBY (CONT'D)

I'm doing you a favor.

МТТСН

(looking at beer spill)

Oh, it's burning through the carpet.

ABBY SMILES, THEN EXITS LEAVING MITCH ALONE.

30 <u>INT. FOX SPORTS - BULLPEN - CONTINUOUS</u>

30

IT'S MORNING. MITCH WALKS INTO THE BULLPEN ON A MISSION AND GOES DIRECTLY TO CHUCK'S OFFICE.

LONG BEAT. MITCH STARTS TO LEAVE. CHUCK STOPS HIM.

CHUCK

You can call me Chuck.

MITCH SMILES.

CHUCK (CONT'D)

Never smile at a man.

MITCH MAKES AN ODD, STRAIGHT FACE.

MITCH

Right. Thanks, Chuck.

Not now. (then)

87% of them are solved by what generates the most revenue and public perception. The primary driving force for players to tune into a fantasy advice show is credibility.

(MORE)

32

MITCH (CONT'D)

Explains why my YouTube channel had a million subscribers and I never wore pants.

MAX LAUGHS. MITCH GIVES HIM A LOOK AND CONTINUES.

MITCH (CONT'D)

They'll never take Abby seriously

dressed like that and I have the data

for Terry to back it up.

(takes breath)

In terms of revenue, MC2, this show needs to be profitable, so it needs a sponsor. I can't have you plugging your energy beer on air... unless you're the title sponsor. Your contract gives you a bonus for any new show you are on. You can use that bonus to cover the cost. (then, to Abby)

Abby, give Summer your outfit-- (then, to Summer)

Max, as the only member of the team I can afford to lose to possible death,
I need you to brief Chuck on what he can and can't say on the air.

MAX

I will make it my mission, Obi Wan.

MITCH

And, Summer, you're in charge of the show's social media campaign. Twitter, Youtube, Facebook, Snapchat, Instagram, and whatever new one there is this week.

SUMMER

ThoughtDump. (then)

Do you mind if I just post pictures of myself in different outfits?

MITCH

Perfect.

THEY ALL LOOK AT MITCH LIKE HE'S A SOLID LEADER.

MITCH (CONT'D)

Guys, five days ago, I asked you to put your trust in me. And, you did. I think. Now, if you could just keep that going for the next two hours and forty-five minutes, I promise we'll all get what we want out of it.

ABBY

What about Chuck? How are you going to teach him about fantasy?

MITCH

I have a plan for that.

FLASH TO:

34 <u>INT. FOX SPORTS - FOX FANTASY SET - MOMENTS LATER</u> (MC2)

MC2

I'm going to have to go with Dez

Bryant this week. He's been on fire.

It's like he's been chugging Powerale!

Now available at Kroeger.

FLASH TO:

They'll do well. Dallas will dominate

DeMarco Murray in this game and a more

conservative passing game approach?

CHUCK

Yes.

MITCH

That's a great fantasy analysis.

Totally agree. Big day for DeMarco

Murray, he's a top 3 running back this

week while lower expectations for Tony

Romo.

(MORE)

MITCH (CONT'D)

Chuck, Eagles are on a bye this week but who should Philly use as their QB, Nick Foles or Mark Sanchez?

CHUCK

I prefer Sanchez over Foles. He's better at pre-snap recognition than Foles, which is a key element of Chip Kelly's offense and my buddies on the team tell me he works his tail off.

Totally against the Mexican stereotype-

37 <u>INT. FOX SPORTS - STAGE - LATER</u> 37 (MITCH, MC2, ABBY, SUMMER, MAX, TERRY, CHUCK, TROY AIKMAN)

PULL BACK FROM A BUNCH OF CHAMPAGNE GLASSES BEING CLINKED TOGETHER. THE WHOLE GANG IS TOGETHER ON THE STAGE, POST SHOW. CHUCK IS ON ONE SIDE OF MITCH. MC2 ON THE OTHER.

ABBY

(re: eyes on forehead)

It's okay. I can be eye candy

sometimes.

CHUCK (CONT'D)

CHUCK LEAVES. TERRY COMES OVER.

TERRY

I bet big on you and it paid off. You achieved your goal - of making sure I didn't fail.

MITCH

Yeah, I think it went well.

TERRY

Don't get too cocky. My dad had a saying about being too proud of your accomplishments. He'd say... 'Don't be.'

MITCH

He really was a man of few words.

TERRY

Now that we've got the show off the ground, I have a new assignment for you: make the show number one.

(beat)

By next week.
 (then, as she walks away)

Oh, and fire Chuck.
