GLORIA (60's) - The matriarch and other half. A genteel, stand-byyour-man, wife and mother who is by no means a pushover. Lives to love and protect her family.

BEAU (30-40) - Eldest son. A momma's boy. A good husband who argues with his good wife a good deal. Smarter than he thinks he is and a truly gifted musician.

BETH (MID 30's) - Middle daughter. Sassy and independent. Picked up a New York accent during her years away. At that scary fork in the road where she could still wind up married with kids or forever be "the fun Aunt."

BILLY (30's) - The baby. The golden child. Smart, handsome, a war vet. Maps a course for his life and follows it without deviation.

LIZ (30-40) - Beau's wife. Mother of three boys. Former party girl and band groupie who is trying to reinvent herself into the mother her husband adores.

JUNE (25) - Billy's fiancée. The Mayor's daughter. Truly sweet and beautiful, like her name. Which makes it hard to tell if her snarky comments are accidental or evil.

ANNA WILSON (30's) - A whip-smart young woman who served in Afghanistan with Billy. African American. Brooklyn native. A create-your-own-destiny kind of woman.

CLAIRE (Fashionable 40) - any ethnicity, New Yorker, a carbon copy of Beth. Fellow pilates teacher.

Doctor WALKER (45) - Beth's cowboy therapist and possible love interest. Convinced Matthew McConaughey stole his entire M.O. Except he says, "Okay,okay,okay."

THE DINOSAURS (ED, HORACE, JIM, ALONZO AND CHUCK) - A racially diverse group of retirees who hang out at the diner with James and crack politically incorrect jokes.

DORIS (50) - A waitress at the diner and Gloria's dear friend from her Women's Methodist Prayer group.

THE MAYOR - (50-60's) - June's Mother. Suave, political type.

COLD OPEN

INT. BEDROOM - NIGHT

DARK ROOM. <u>BETH</u> (MID 30'S, DRAMATIC MIDDLE CHILD) IS ASLEEP. A CELL PHONE RINGS. SHE FUMBLES IN THE DARK AND ANSWERS.

BETH

(GROGGY) Hello?

CORNER OF SCREEN:

INT. TRENDY BAR IN NEW YORK CITY - CONTINUOUS

THE BAR IS PACKED. <u>CLAIRE</u> (MID 30'S, FABULOUS) YELLS INTO HER PHONE.

CLAIRE

Beth, it's Claire. I'm at a new

whiskey bar in downtown Manhattan

called Bitters. Get down here! First

drink is free if you're single, broke

and bitter.

BETH

Give me two minutes to find a clean

bra and working credit card!

BETH TURNS ON A LAMP <u>REVEALING</u> SHE'S IN HER FRILLY, YELLOW, CHILDHOOD BEDROOM. SHE SCREAMS.

BETH (CONT'D)

Ahhhhhhhhh! (THEN, IN SHOCK) Claire,

I can't go. I forgot, I moved back to

my parents' house in Texas.

CLAIRE

You're in Texas?!

BETH

(HORROR) I can see a football field from my window.

CLAIRE

Beth, why would you do that?! Women our age are grandmothers in Texas!

BETH

(PANICKED) I don't know... because I'm single, broke and bitter?! My parents called and asked me to move home and help run the family music store so my Dad could retire--

CLAIRE

You left the Big Apple for that?

BETH

I had a rat trapped under a salad bowl

at the time. Seemed like a good offer.

LOUD SIRENS START GOING OFF OUTSIDE. WIND RATTLES THE WINDOW.

BETH (CONT'D)

Oh, great. Tornado sirens. Texas' way

of welcoming me back.

RESET TO:

INT. HALLWAY TO THE BEDROOMS - CONTINUOUS

BETH'S BROTHER, <u>BILLY</u> (30'S, THE GOLDEN CHILD, AIR FORCE VET) <u>EXITS</u> HIS BEDROOM CARRYING BOOTS AND A JACKET.

BILLY

Mom, Dad, wake up, tornado!

<u>GLORIA</u> (60'S, A DEMURE SPITFIRE) <u>BOLTS</u> OUT OF THEIR BEDROOM AND STARTS GRABBING PHOTOS OFF THE WALL. <u>JAMES</u> (60'S, MODERN DAY ANDY GRIFFITH) IS RIGHT BEHIND HER.

JAMES

Billy, you get Beth. Mom and I will meet you in the storm shelter.

BILLY

(PUTTING ON BOOTS) Yes, sir.

JAMES

(GENTLY) Gloria, pace yourself. You

have a whole wall downstairs.

GLORIA

I need Billy's Air Force photo... Beau

leaning on a wagon wheel in autumn...

JAMES HERDS GLORIA DOWN THE HALLWAY. HER ARMS ARE FULL.

RESET TO:

INT. BETH'S BEDROOM

BILLY ENTERS TO FIND BETH SITTING ON HER BED IN A STUPOR.

BILLY

Beth, grab a coat and shoes and let's

go, there's a tornado!

BETH

Why bother? My life's a bust. I failed as a fashion designer. I failed at love. I'm right where I was at fifteen except my diary has more swear words.

BILLY

Can we have this pity party later? A

couch just blew past your window!

BILLY HUNTS AROUND THE ROOM FOR A COAT AND SHOES.

BETH

Of course you have no compassion! Your life is a fairy tale.

BILLY

I served two tours in Afghanistan.

BETH

And didn't suffer a single injury! In fact, you came home buff and tan. The town threw you a parade. Then you meet June, the Mayor's daughter, no less. And "BOOM" now you're getting married.

BILLY

Not if I die in a tornado! Now, put

this on and let's go!

BILLY HANDS HER A TRENDY FAUX-FUR JACKET AND BOOTS.

BETH

I can't wear those together.

THE WINDOWS RATTLE. BETH SCREAMS, TAKES STUFF AND THEY RUN.

CUT TO:

INT. TORNADO SHELTER - CONTINUOUS

THE ENTIRE GODARD FAMILY IS PACKED INTO THIS CEMENT BUNKER:

IN ADDITION TO JAMES, GLORIA, BILLY AND BETH IS ELDEST SON, <u>BEAU</u> (35-40, GOOD OL' BOY), HIS WIFE <u>LIZ</u> (35-40, PARTY GIRL TURNED MOM), THEIR THREE BOYS, <u>HOUSTON</u>, <u>AUSTIN</u> AND <u>DALLAS</u>, (6-12). THEY ALL LISTEN TO THE STORM RAGING OUTSIDE. BETH CRIES.

JAMES

(CHIPPER) I can't even remember the last time the whole family was together in the tornado shelter.

GLORIA

I've been praying to have all my babies home, under one roof and, look, here we are! Billy home from Afghanistan...

EVERYONE

Thank you for your service.

GLORIA

Beth home from New York. And Beau home from his house down the street.

BILLY

Just curious, Beau. Why didn't you go to your storm shelter?

BEAU

We couldn't get in. (POINTED TO LIZ)

It's full of canned soup.

LIZ

You told me to "Buy in bulk!" Where

was I supposed to put it?

EVERY TIME THE WIND HOWLS, BETH WHIMPERS INTO HER TISSUE.

JAMES

What an unexpected treat this is! Sure wish I had a camera.

BILLY

You do. There's one on the smartwatch we got you for your retirement.

JAMES CHECKS OUT HIS WATCH.

JAMES

Look at that, sure does! I already got some pictures of my sleeve. (AIMING) Squeeze in everyone.

GLORIA

Good idea, James. Who knows where we'll be next tornado? Billy will probably be married and living across town with June. Beau and Liz may have eaten all their soup. And Beth...

BETH

(TEARY) Where, Mom? Where will I be? On a date with the guy who named his mule "Obama" so he could say "Obama is a jackass"?

GLORIA

No. (THEN) Although Tate is single. THE WIND RATTLES THE DOOR VIOLENTLY.

JAMES

Everyone say "Twister!"

JAMES SNAPS A PICTURE THAT LEADS OFF THE MONTAGE IN OUR... <u>MAIN TITLES:</u> BILLY JOE SHAVER'S "I'M JUST AN OLD CHUNK OF COAL" PLAYS OVER PHOTOS FROM THIS TEXAS LOCALE: FOOTBALL FIELDS, PUMP-JACKS, CHURCHES, DINERS, TAVERNS, ETC.

END COLD OPENING

ACT ONE

SCENE A

INT. KITCHEN - EARLY MORNING

GLORIA IS PREPARING PANCAKES. JAMES TOYS WITH HIS SMARTWATCH.

JAMES

Honey, did my restless legs keep you

up last night?

GLORIA

(REASSURING KISS) Not at all.

JAMES

Are you sure? My smartwatch says I

walked three miles last night.

GLORIA

Did you ever figure out how to tell

the time?

JAMES

Yep. (READING THE WATCH ON HIS OTHER

WRIST) Seven forty-three a.m.

BILLY ENTERS DRESSED IN A COMMERCIAL AIRLINE PILOT UNIFORM.

GLORIA

Billy, why are you dressed for work? I thought you had the day off.

BILLY

I just got called to fill in on a flight to Dallas.

GLORIA

What?! You can't fly a plane on

pancakes, you need protein!

GLORIA PULLS MEAT AND EGGS OUT OF THE FRIDGE AND JUGGLES SEVERAL FRYING PANS ON THE STOVE LIKE IT'S AN OLYMPIC EVENT.

BILLY

Mom, it's okay. There's no need to--

JAMES

Son. Don't cancel her Christmas. (READING SMARTWATCH) So, according to my fancy watch, in one month and six hundred calories you'll be a married man. How you feeling?

BILLY

Awesome. Tactically speaking, I'm right on course with my life map. Emotionally, I feel a deep love for June that I predict will only grow.

JAMES

If those are your vows, I'm gonna suggest you scrap it and spend a day in the greeting card aisle.

BILLY

I really only have one concern regarding this wedding.

GLORIA

That June is a Baptist and you're Methodist and how will this work?

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BILLY
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No.

GLORIA

Us either.

BILLY

I'm worried about Beth ruining my wedding. You saw her last night. She needs professional help.

GLORIA

Like a hairstylist? Sadly, her only option is to grow those bangs out.

BILLY

No, mom, a <u>therapist</u>. Someone who can help her sort out her issue<u>s</u>. Plural.

JAMES AND GLORIA ARE TAKEN ABACK BY THIS SUGGESTION.

JAMES

Does Longview even have a therapist?

GLORIA

Well, there's the guy we go to with

all our problems. God.

BILLY

Prayer is great, but there is no shame going to a doctor to get a check-up from the neck-up. That's one thing I drilled into my squadron when we got home from the Middle East.

JAMES/GLORIA

Thank you for your service./ So proud.

BILLY

I've been home a year and a half. You guys can stop doing that.

GLORIA

Know who I blame for Beth's mess? That "Sex and the City" gal, Sarah Michelle Jessica Parker Posie.

JAMES

You've got a few extra names in there.

GLORIA

She lured a whole generation of women to New York with the promise of endless brunches and romance only to be spit out a decade later bloated and alone with no life savings and three hundred pairs of shoes.

JAMES

Where's Beth's Mr. Big? Huh? (OFF LOOK) We watch the show in reruns.

GLORIA

TBS takes out all the nudity and swear

words. It's a cute program.

REVEAL BETH IN THE DOORWAY, DISHEVELED, BUT HAPPY AND CALM.

BETH

Morning.

EVERYONE

Beeeeth! / Hey. / Did you rest well?

BETH

I just had <u>the</u> best sleep of my life. I feel like a new person. All that

anxiety I was having? Gone.

BILLY

Really? Just like that.

BETH

I don't know if it's being out of the city, or almost dying last night, or the years of recreational Xanax just wore off, but I feel fantastic.

Pancakes! (HAPPY DANCE) Yay!

JAMES

There's our girl! She's back!

GLORIA

See, Billy? Beth didn't need therapy.

She just needed prayer and pancakes.

BETH

You thought I needed therapy? Why?

BILLY

I don't know. You seem to be going through some... disillusionment.

BETH

(PLAYFUL) Oh, little brother. You do not want to go head to head with me when it comes to self-analysis. I've dated <u>a lot</u> of neurotic Jewish guys. Almost married Eli, but he said I live in my reptilian brain. - which, now that I think about it, has been in overdrive since I got here. *Hence*, the extreme anxiety. (AIR KICK) Boom!

GLORIA AND JAMES CLAP, ENJOYING HER PLAYFUL MOOD.

BILLY

I also think you're angry I'm getting married before you. (WEAKLY) Boom.

GLORIA

Pancakes!

JAMES

Yay!

BETH

What? First of all, I don't need a man to be complete. I mean, if it happens, great, if not, that's cool, too. Not that I'm wishing it away. I'm open. But, not desperate. WHATEVER! Secondly, I'm nothing but happy for you (EYES CLOSED) and June.

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BILLY
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Why did you close your eyes?

BETH

Did I?

BILLY

You don't like June.

BETH

I do. I do. She's just very...

GLORIA

Baptist?

BETH

I was going to say chipper. Look, I appreciate the concern, but I'm fine.

I'm the last one that needs therapy.

BEAU AND LIZ ENTER WITH BAGS OF LAUNDRY.

BEAU

Our washer just killed itself. Liz overloaded it. It started rocking and, basically, walked out the back door.

LIZ

And Beau just watched it go! Bye!

BEAU

 \underline{I} was dealing with the pot of oatmeal that exploded all over the kitchen.

GLORIA

Liz, honey, use ours. Detergent and fabric softener are in the cabinet.

LIZ EXITS IN A HUFF, DRAGGING THE LAUNDRY BAGS.

BEAU

Mom, Dad, you raised three kids, your

house never looked like a war zone.

What is Liz doing wrong?

JAMES

Nothing. Considering you two met leg-

wrestling in a bar, Liz has exceeded

all our expectations.

GLORIA

Breakfast is ready. Everyone sit.

EVERYONE SITS. THIS IS GLORIA'S MOMENT TO SHINE. AS SHE SERVES EACH MEMBER A HEARTY PLATE THEY "OOO AND AHHH."

GLORIA (CONT'D)

James... Beau...

BEAU

Yum. I'm starving. I only had a few

bites of oatmeal off the wall.

GLORIA

Nothing brings me more joy than

feeding my family. (WINK) Don't tell

the feminists. Beth ...

BETH

Mom, feminists love feeding their

families, too.

GLORIA

Sure, when they're home. Billy...

JUST THEN JUNE ENTERS CARRYING A COVERED PLATE OF FOOD.

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JUNE
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Billy, I brought you breakfast. Egg

white omelette. (SEEING THE FOOD) Oh.

GLORIA

We were just about to ...

BILLY HAS TWO PLATES BEING OFFERED, HE'S NOT SURE WHAT TO DO.

JUNE

Mine's high in protein.

GLORIA

Mine, too. Eggs and bacon.

JUNE

Low-fat? He has a tuxedo to fit into.

AFTER AN AWKWARD BEAT, GLORIA ACQUIESCES HER PLATE.

GLORIA

You go ahead, June.

JUNE SETS DOWN HER PLATE. GLORIA IS LEFT HANGING.

JAMES

I'll take Billy's plate. I'm starving.

I've already walked three miles today.

JUNE

Sorry to barge in so early, I just

wanted to see Billy before he left.

BILLY

Can't wait to be in the same house.

BEAU

What are you waiting for? I lived with Liz before I knew her name.

BILLY

June is the Mayor's daughter. She has

a public image to consider.

JUNE

And we wanted to wait until we're

married. Like Gloria and James did.

GLORIA, STILL REELING, FORCES A TIGHT SMILE.

JUNE (CONT'D)

Oh, and I have exciting news!

BETH

(POINTED) About the wedding I hope.

JUNE

Oh, Beth. I didn't see you there.

(GIGGLE) I thought you were a chair.

BETH SHAKES IT OFF. NOTE: JUNE IS GENUINELY SWEET AND OBLIVIOUS TO THE INSULTS SHE SLINGS AT BETH.

JUNE (CONT'D)

The newspaper wants to cover our

couple's shower on Saturday!

EVERYONE REACTS, TRULY IMPRESSED AND EXCITED.

BEAU

You two are like Longview's Prince

Charles and Lady Diana. Without the

cheating, divorce and tragic ending.

BETH

Hopefully.

JUNE

Since we're having it at the music store, I'm going to send over even more decorations so it doesn't look like we're having it at a music store.

BETH

(GOOD SPORT) I'm happy to put them up

for you. If you want. I am a designer.

JUNE

Thank you! You're the absolute best. I

just want everything to look perfect.

JUNE HANDS BETH A HAIRBRUSH FROM HER PURSE. BETH STARES AT IT IN DISBELIEF, THEN EVENTUALLY BRUSHES HER WILD BED-HEAD HAIR.

JUNE (CONT'D)

Now, if everyone will stop eating, I

have a special question for Gloria.

CONFUSED BY THE REQUEST, EVERYONE PUTS DOWN THEIR SILVERWARE.

JUNE (CONT'D)

After trying on my Vera Wang wedding

dress, again, it just feels so hollow.

I want a symbol of the dreams and

hopes I want for my life. Gloria...

May I have the honor of wearing your

wedding dress down the aisle?--

GLORIA IS A DEER IN THE HEADLIGHTS. BEFORE SHE CAN ANSWER ...

BETH

(FLIPPING THE TABLE) NOOO! It's mine.

Mine, MINE, MINE!

(MORE)

BETH (CONT'D)

<u>I'm</u> going to wear it. <u>Me</u>! At <u>my</u>

wedding. Not you! Wear your own

Mother's dress!--

JUNE

(GROSS FACE) She married in the 80's.

BETH

Tough! It is my birthright! I won't

let you bounce in here with your shiny

hair and take it!

LIZ STANDS FROZEN IN THE DOORWAY WITH FABRIC SOFTENER.

JUNE

But, what if you never get marr--

EVERYONE

JUNE!

BILLY

Oh, look, I'm going to miss my flight.

Let's go. See you guys tonight.

JUNE

Beth, I didn't mean to upset you!

BILLY QUICKLY USHERS JUNE OUT THE DOOR. AFTER A BEAT...

JAMES

I'll ask around about a therapist.

BETH

Yep.

SCENE B

INT. DINER - LATER

"THE DINOSAURS" (<u>ED</u>, <u>ALONZO</u>, <u>CHUCK</u>, <u>FLOYD</u> AND JAMES) DRINK COFFEE AND SHOOT THE BULL.

ED

Answer me this - how is it every time there's a big news story in town, reporters interview some redneck wearing a lawn chair for a hat?

EVERYONE

I know!/ Ever' time./ Why is that?

ALONZO

There's eighty thousand people in

Longview, grab one with teeth!

THE GUYS ALL LAUGH. FLOYD, WHO IS MISSING A TOOTH ...

FLOYD

Not to say that missing a tooth or two

automatically makes you unintelligent --

EVERYONE

Nope./ No way./ Nobody saying that.

CHUCK

But, going off the evening news, no wonder people think Texans are dumb.

JAMES

Yeah. Maybe people in the Blue States aren't <u>all</u> liberal morons.

THEY PONDER A MOMENT.

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CHUCK
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No, they are.

GUYS AGREE.

JAMES

Speaking of morons, any of you know if

there's a good therapist in town?

FLOYD

Why? You questioning your sexuality?

THE GUYS BUST A GUT.

FLOYD (CONT'D)

I can say that, my son's gay.

JAMES

No, Beth is struggling with this upcoming wedding.

ALONZO

Me too. I'm trying to decide if I

should bring my wife or have fun.

GUYS LAUGH.

CHUCK

You know, when I had my veterinarian practice I used to call on this guy, Doctor Walker, who worked wonders on temperamental cattle and horses.

JAMES

(CONSIDERS, THEN) Get me his number.

CUT TO:

SCENE C

INT. LIVING ROOM - LATER

GLORIA IS DUSTING. SHE GLANCES OUT THE WINDOW AND GASPS.

GLORIA

June!

GLORIA RUSHES OVER AND LOCKS THE FRONT DOOR JUST AS JUNE TRIES TO WALK IN. GLORIA HIDES AGAINST THE WALL. JUNE KNOCKS.

JUNE

Gloria? It's June. Your door is locked. (PEERING IN) Gloria? I can see you in the mirror on the wall. Are you okay?

GLORIA COMES OUT OF HIDING AND ANSWERS THE DOOR.

GLORIA

Hi! I was just seeing how tall I am.

(POINTS TO A SPOT ON WALL) That tall.

JUNE

Did you get my messages? I need to

talk to you about the wedding dress.

GLORIA

I was just about to call you back when it occurred to me I might have shrunk.

JUNE

I felt so terrible about upsetting Beth this morning that I went straight home and prayed about it.

GLORIA

(RELIEVED) June, that's so nice.

JUNE

And God said he really wants me to

wear your wedding dress.

GLORIA

Really? He said that.

JUNE

He thinks it's a wonderful way to

honor your and James' marriage.

GLORIA

Well, thing is... (SHE'S GOT NOTHING)

LIZ ENTERS FROM THE HALLWAY HOLDING PINK LAUNDRY.

LIZ

Help! My red bra snuck in and murdered

all our clothes.

GLORIA

Oh, no! Be right there sweetheart. So sorry, June. Liz needs me. We'll talk

later.

GLORIA CROSSES TO LIZ AND MOUTHS TO GOD "THANK YOU."

CUT TO:

SCENE D

INT. MUSIC STORE - LATER

BEAU SHOWS BETH HOW TO RING UP A CUSTOMER.

BEAU

And then you hit total...

BETH

I worked here all through high school,

Beau, I remember how to do it.

BEAU

Cool your jets, doofus, we updated the

system while you were in NYC city.

BETH

You just said "New York City City"

dummy. You're the dumb one. (THEN,

GIVING CHANGE) Here you are, sir.

THE CUSTOMER STARES AT HER, WAITING. BEAU NUDGES BETH.

BETH (CONT'D)

Oh. (TO CUSTOMER) Have a nice day.

CUSTOMER CAN NOW EXIT.

BETH (CONT'D)

(UNDER HER BREATH) Texas.

BEAU STARTS PUTTING UP SHOWER DECORATIONS.

BEAU

Look at all this. I never even heard of a "couple's shower." They make my and Liz's wedding seem like a joke.

BETH

Stop. It was a blast. Even when Liz broke her arm on the mechanical bull.

JAMES ENTERS, A PEP IN HIS STEP.

JAMES

Beth, Daddy did it! I found a doctor. And he'll see you today.

BETH

You did? What is he? A psychologist,

psychiatrist, counselor, therapist...

JAMES

Doctor Walker is a "behavioral

specialist." Word is he works wonders

with temperamental... personalities.

BETH

Okay. But I am only committing to one visit.

JAMES

Your appointment is right after work. Beau can take you.

BEAU

Okay, but let Liz know where I am. If I'm late she gets jealous and assumes the worst. That I'm eating at Mom's.

CUT TO:

SCENE E

INT. DINER - LATER

GLORIA ENTERS HOLDING A DRESS BOX. "THE DINOSAURS" ARE THERE.

ED

... I like Trump because he tells it

like it is.

CHUCK

So does my drunk uncle, but I don't

want him to be president.

GLORIA APPROACHES THEM.

GLORIA

Hey, fellas. Is Doris around?

FLOYD

She's in back marrying the ketchups.

And Kentucky is up in arms about it.

THE GUYS BUST UP LAUGHING. <u>DORIS</u> <u>ENTERS</u> FROM THE BACK AND GLORIA <u>CROSSES</u> TO HER. THIS MEETING WAS PREARRANGED.

DORIS

(COVERT) Is that the dress?

GLORIA

June is giving me no choice. She's

relentless!

DORIS

Just like a Baptist. Always got to be

their way.

GLORIA

If I let June wear it, Beth would think I'm giving up on her.

DORIS

Why don't you just tell June that?

GLORIA

And give her a chance to point out that Beth might not ever get married? Never. I'd rather compromise my Christian morals and lie.

DORIS

You won't have to. Give me the dress. GLORIA PASSES HER THE BOX.

GLORIA

Where is it going?

DORIS

<u>Where</u> is none of your concern. The Methodist Women's prayer group will draw straws. Short stick will store the dress in a secure location. When June asks, you can honestly say, you, don't know where the dress is.

GLORIA

Thank you. You're a good friend.

DORIS

Thank you... for "stealing" my

grandson's motorcycle.

GLORIA PUTS HER FINGER TO HER LIPS, "SHHHHH." LIKE A SPY.

CUT TO:

SCENE H

INT. COCKPIT - DAY

PILOT, <u>ANNA WILSON</u> (30'S, AFRICAN AMERICAN, WHIP-SMART) GOES OVER A CHECK LIST AS BILLY AND ANOTHER PILOT, <u>GAIL</u>, <u>ENTER</u>.

GAIL

Captain Godard, this is first officer ---

BILLY

Anna?!

ANNA

Billy ?! I... I didn't know you were

working for Heartland Air.

BILLY

(TO GAIL) Technical Sergeant Wilson

and I were in Afghanistan together

she's like a brother to me.

GAIL

A hot, Brooklyn born, brotha from anotha motha. (LAUGHS TOO HARD, THEN)

I'll grab flight details.

GAIL EXITS.

BILLY

So, you're based here in Dallas?

ANNA

Yeah. I was planning to get in touch.

BILLY

(AWKWARD) Anna, I hope you weren't avoiding me because of San Diego. That whole thing was my fault.

ANNA

No. We were both so happy to be on

American soil... we got carried away.

BILLY

I'm the one who kept pouring shots.

ANNA

I asked you to dance to Marvin Gaye.

BILLY

Look, I took your advice. I wiped the whole incident from my mind--

ANNA

Yeah, about that...

BILLY

--in fact, I'm getting married next month. I want you to be there. The

whole squadron is coming.

WHATEVER ANNA WAS GOING TO SAY, SHE'S NOT SAYING NOW.

ANNA

Married. Congratulations! Of course.

Wouldn't miss it for the world.

GAIL ENTERS CARRYING PAPERWORK.

BILLY

We're having a couple's shower this weekend, please come. I want you to meet Anna-- I mean, June. You're Anna.

ANNA

I don't know. It's short notice.

GAIL

If you need a baby sitter, Anna, I

have one. She's great with infants.

ANNA BLANCHES.

BILLY

A baby? Anna, you had a baby?

GAIL

Ida is so cute you should see her.

BILLY

You're a mother? Congratulations! When

did this happen?

ANNA

Thanks! Like...(CAGEY) thirty-six weeks ago. (THEN) Guess we better head out before the passengers start rocking the plane.

GAIL

Oh, yeah, them. Billy, want to do the honors?

BILLY GRABS THE INTERCOM.

BILLY

You bet. A baby, that's crazy. (INTO INTERCOM) Welcome to Heartland Air, "Where No Detail is Overlooked."

OFF ANNA'S RELIEVED EXPRESSION WE...

CUT TO:

SCENE I

INT. DIVE BAR - LATER

BETH SITS AT THE BAR WITH <u>DOCTOR WALKER</u>, WHO WEARS A COWBOY HAT AND BEARS AN UNCANNY LIKENESS TO MATTHEW MCCONAUGHEY. THEY HAVE DRINKS. BETH IS DUBIOUS.

BETH

You don't work out of an office?

DOCTOR

I have one but it smells like feed. Okay-okay-okay. Why is love eluding you pretty girl? You're cute as all get out, so it's not an ugly issue. (THEN) What's wrong? Your eyes are darting, that means you wanna bolt.

BETH

I'm just confused. Is this therapy or a date?

DOCTOR

Both. On the phone your Dad said you were out of sorts about being single. Thought we could hit two birds... I'm all about practical medicine, B.

BETH

What, exactly are you a doctor of?

DOCTOR

No, no. My first name is Doctor. I have brothers named Colonel and Judge. My Dad is King. It's a family thing.

BETH

Oh, Texas. (THEN) Excuse me, bartender! (HANDING HIM A CREDIT CARD) This is for <u>my</u> wine not the fake doctor's whiskey.

THE BARTENDER RUNS THE CARD.

DOCTOR

Whoa. You're spooked? You shouldn't

be. True, I have no degree, but I'm

the nation's premier bovine therapist--

BARTENDER

I'm sorry ma'am but--

BETH

(HANDS HIM ANOTHER) Try this one.

THE BARTENDER TRIES THE NEW CARD.

DOCTOR

--and cattle are just people in coats.

BETH

Please stop talking.

DOCTOR

Oh, you wanna dance?

HE PULLS HER CLOSE TO HIM, SHE GOES WITH IT A SEC, THEN...

BETH

No! I don't want to dance or date or

get therapy from some Matthew

McConaughey wanna-be.

DOCTOR

Whoa-whoa-whoa! He's my wanna-be. I

invented the triple affirmative.

THE BARTENDER TOSSES BACK THE CARD. BETH THROWS HIM ANOTHER.

BARTENDER

Ma'am, this is a library card.

BETH

Just run it! (LOSING IT) Why does

everything have to be so hard? I'm

just trying to figure out why I can't

find a perfect relationship like my

parents!! Beau, let's go!

REVEAL BEAU HAVING A BEER NEARBY. BETH STARTS TO STORM OUT.

DOCTOR

(CATTLE WHISPER) Spspspspspspspsp.

BETH

What are you doing? What is that?

SHE CAN'T HELP BUT MOVE CLOSER.

DOCTOR

Spspspspspspsps. (THEN) I said, your

parents sure did set you up to fail.

BETH STARTS OUT, TURNS BACK, TROTS AROUND, THEN...

BETH

You think this might be their fault?

(SITTING) Tell me more.

FADE OUT.

END OF ACT ONE

ACT TWO

SCENE J

INT. LIVING ROOM - LATER

JUNE AND GLORIA ENTER FROM UPSTAIRS. JAMES READS A BOOK.

JUNE

It's not in any of the closets.

GLORIA

I, honestly, do not know where the

wedding dress is.

JUNE

(PUSHY) Mind if I check the attic?

GLORIA

Knock yourself out.

JUNE CROSSES OFF. BILLY ENTERS THE FRONT DOOR.

BILLY

Guess who I ran into at work today?

Technical Sergeant Anna Wilson.

GLORIA

Anna. She wrote us the sweetest thank you card for the care package we sent.

JAMES

Hon, you did send her a thank you note for the thank you note, didn't you?

GLORIA

Yes. And she sent back the nicest thank you note. I owe her a note.

BILLY

Well, you can give it to her Saturday. She's coming to the party. Oh, <u>and</u> she had a baby. Can you believe that?

JAMES

You mean, she enlisted for another

tour of doody. Pun intended.

GLORIA

That's wonderful. How old? I'll get

the baby an outfit.

BILLY

Umm...Thirty-six weeks, she said.

GLORIA

So... nine months. How sweet.

BILLY

Yeah, guess that would be nine months.

(THEN) Wait?... Nine months?

IT, FINALLY, HITS BILLY. HE STARTS COUNTING... GROWING PALE. BETH AND BEAU <u>BURST</u> THROUGH THE DOOR.

BETH

It's Mom and Dad's fault I'm single!

Yeah! In fact, when it comes to

relationships, they screwed us <u>all</u> up!

BEAU

(MISTAKING BILLY'S SHOCKED EXPRESSION)

I know! I couldn't believe it either!

BILLY

I need to splash water on my face.

BILLY EXITS TO KITCHEN. JAMES AND GLORIA ARE STUNNED.

BETH

It's all so clear! You guys gave us an unrealistic model of marriage. And then sent us into the world with no skills to survive.

BEAU

(ANNOYED) You never even fought in

front of us. Never. Not once.

JAMES

That's not true. We fought.

BEAU

When? Name one time.

GLORIA

Remember when that tornado blew the roof off the music store? Your Dad and I got into a huge fight over who... (TRAILING OFF) loved the other more. Let me think of another example.

BEAU

Of course my marriage looks miserable ...when I hold it up to yours.

BETH

And I've been waiting for a guy who is blind to my flaws, the way Dad is to

yours. And that's not realistic!

GLORIA LOOKS TO JAMES, "I HAVE FLAWS?" JAMES SHAKES HIS HEAD "NO."

JUNE ENTERS FROM THE HALLWAY BRUSHING OFF COBWEBS.

JUNE

No luck on the dress.

BETH

June, forget the dress. You and Billy have to stop trying to emulate Mom and Dad. It can't be done.

BILLY ENTERS, HEAD AND SHIRT ARE DRIPPING WET.

JUNE

(CHIPPER) Of course it can. All we have to do is stick to our life map. Right, Billy?

BILLY

(STARTING TO SPIN OUT) Yes. Just stay the course - Air force, commercial pilot, fall in love, get married, run for political office, have three kids, be happy like Mom and Dad. Boom! Easy! (THEN) I gotta... upstairs.

BILLY EXITS UPSTAIRS A WRECK.

DISSOLVE TO:

SCENE K

INT. BETH'S BEDROOM - LATER

BETH IS ASLEEP, BILLY TURNS ON THE LIGHT.

BILLY

(SOFTLY) Beth, wake up--

SHE JUMPS UP, GRABBING SHOES AND A COAT.

BETH

Ahhh, Tornado?! Again?

BILLY

No, Beth, calm down.

BETH

(NOTICING BILLY'S FACE) What's wrong?

BILLY

I think I might have fathered a baby

with Anna Wilson.

BETH

(GASP) Sergeant Anna Wilson?

BILLY

We had a drunk one-night stand the day we returned from overseas.

BETH

Oh. My. God. (EXCITED) I've never been on this side of the equation - the one not in a crisis. It feels amazing.

BILLY

Beth.

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BETH
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Sorry, sorry. I'm here for you.

BILLY

I can't sleep. I can't think. June. June would be devastated.

BETH

It was before you two met. She'd... (WEAK) understand. Ugh. Sorry. I didn't sell that at all.

BILLY

I don't know what to do.

BETH

Okay. Why not call Anna and ask?

BILLY

I didn't get her number. (SNARKY) <u>And</u>, this isn't a conversation to have over the phone. "Hi, watcha doing? Hey, did I get you pregnant?"

BETH

Okay. You're lashing out. I do that, too, under stress.

BILLY

Poor Mom and Dad. What will they say? I'm their golden child.

BETH

Billy, you don't know for sure the baby is yours.

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BILLY
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But, what if it is?

BETH

Then, you will step up and take responsibility for your life.

SHE REALIZES THAT ADVICE IS FOR HER, TOO.

BETH (CONT'D)

And Mom and Dad will say what they said to me when I got arrested for living in a movie theater. "We love you. How can we help?" And in my case, "How is 'No Country for Old Men?'"

BILLY

I just don't want to be an embarrassment to this family.

BETH

That's my job. And I'm not giving it up to anyone. Not even Beau, who is making a real play for it with that tattoo of Garth Brooks on his calf. (THEN) Hey, I know it seems like the world is ending, but, it's going to be okay. (GIDDY) I can't believe <u>I</u> finally got to say that.

CUT TO:

SCENE L

INT. MUSIC STORE - SATURDAY NIGHT

THE PLACE IS DECORATED. A TABLE IS STACKED WITH GIFTS. EVERYONE IN TOWN IS THERE. WE FIND JAMES SHOWING OFF HIS WATCH TO THE DINOSAURS. BETH IS THERE.

JAMES

And if my heart rate gets too high, it

plays "Deep In The Heart Of Texas."

ED

You've gone all fancy now that you're

about to be related to the Mayor.

ALONZO

He won't have to feed another meter in

this town for the rest of his life.

JAMES

(EATING IT UP) Don't know about that.

CHUCK

Maybe you can throw your weight around and get the speed limit on Main

lowered. Twenty-five is too damn fast!

GLORIA WALKS UP AND HANDS A PLATE TO JAMES.

JAMES

Why would you put catfish on my plate?

GLORIA

I can't keep track of all your food allergies. Next time get it yourself.

JAMES

I will. (BEAT) That is exhausting.

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BETH
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What are you two doing?

GLORIA

Trying out our hand at bickering.

BETH

Please don't. I'm sorry I blamed you. My life is where it is because of me. (THEN) In fact, Mom, you can give June the dress. Who knows if I'll get married? And someone should wear it.

GLORIA

(THINKING) I, honestly, don't know

where it is.

GLORIA WALKS AWAY. DOCTOR APPROACHES BETH.

DOCTOR

My-my-my, you look stunning, B.

BETH

Don't shorten my name. It's Beth.

DOCTOR

Short for Elizabeth?

BETH

I didn't invite you to this, Doctor.

DOCTOR

The Mayor did. I wrangle her difficult heifers. Make them see love is there for them if they decide to take it. Can I get you another drink?

BETH

Fine. But, only as my therapist. I'm

not interested in you romantically.

DOCTOR

You got it, sexy.

BEAU AND LIZ WALK IN WITH THEIR ROWDY <u>BOYS</u>. BEAU AND THE BOYS ARE ALL WEARING PINK TINTED DRESS SHIRTS.

LIZ

Thanks for not being mad about the

laundry.

BEAU

If I really cared about white shirts I

wouldn't have married a Bud Girl.

THEY KISS, THEN, TO THE RAMBUNCTIOUS BOYS ...

BEAU/LIZ

Knock it off!/ Those presents aren't

yours./ Put them down! DOWN!

THE <u>MAYOR</u> CLINKS HER GLASS. HER <u>HUSBAND</u>, JUNE AND BILLY STAND WITH HER. BILLY IS DISTRACTED, LOOKING FOR ANNA.

MAYOR

Thank you all for coming! Not only are we excited to welcome the Godards to our family, but this wedding is bringing together two of Longview's biggest gang rivals. (WINK) The Methodists and the Baptists.

THE TWO CAMPS CHUCKLE AT EACH OTHER, GOOD-NATUREDLY.

MAYOR (CONT'D)

In all seriousness, when I rattle on

about traditional family values, this,

right here, is what I'm talking 'bout.

To the bride and groom!

CHEERS! THE ROOM TOASTS BILLY AND JUNE. THE NEWSPAPER <u>PHOTOGRAPHER</u> SNAPS PHOTOS. BILLY SPOTS ANNA <u>ENTER</u> THE DOOR CARRYING A BIG GIFT AND EXCUSES HIMSELF TO GREET HER.

BILLY

Anna, you made it.

ANNA

(RE: GIFT) The only thing left on your

registry was a trash can.

BILLY

I really need to talk to you. Can we

step into the rehearsal room a second?

BILLY AND ANNA EXIT INTO THE REHEARSAL ROOM.

RESET TO:

INT. REHEARSAL ROOM - CONTINUOUS

IT'S A SOUNDPROOF ROOM SURROUNDED BY GLASS WINDOWS, A PIANO INSIDE. BILLY AND ANNA TALK.

BILLY

I know I am crazy for asking this,

there's no way you wouldn't have told

me, but... Ida isn't my baby, is she?

ANNA

Oh, Billy. This is not how I planned on telling you.

43.

BILLY

I'm a father? You're saying I'm a

father?!

ANNA FEELS ESPECIALLY AWKWARD HOLDING A BIG GIFT.

ANNA

I really need to put this down.

SHE DOES.

BILLY

When were you planning to let me know?

ANNA

At first, never. I thought, why should our one night stand wreck both our lives? But, once Ida was born and I had this amazing little girl, I realized how stupid that plan was.

BILLY

Is that why you moved to Dallas?

ANNA

Yes. I was waiting for the right time to tell you. And, just before your wedding didn't seem... ideal.

BILLY

(CHOKING UP) Sorry, it's just sinking in. I'm a Dad. I have a daughter.

ANNA

Billy, I only want you to be in Ida's

life, if you want to be. If not, I

understand. No one ever needs to know.

BETH OPENS THE DOOR AND TIP-TOES INTO THE ROOM.

BILLY

Beth! What?!

BETH

I'm just going to turn the external

speaker off. Everyone can hear you.

REVEAL THE ENTIRE PARTY STARING AT THEM IN SHOCK.

CUT TO:

INT. MUSIC STORE - CONTINUOUS

YOU COULD HEAR A PIN DROP. GLORIA MUTTERS TO JAMES.

GLORIA

(SHOCKED) This might be my fault. I've

been praying for a granddaughter.

CUT BACK TO:

INT. REHEARSAL ROOM - CONTINUOUS

BILLY

Oh, man.

AS THE CONVERSATION BELOW HAPPENS, WE CAN SEE THE FOLLOWING MAYHEM OUT THE WINDOW, BUT CAN'T HEAR IT: THE PHOTOGRAPHER CAPTURES PHOTOS, THE BAPTISTS AND METHODISTS ARGUE, PEOPLE ARE TAKING THEIR PRESENTS BACK, BEAU AND DOCTOR PHYSICALLY BLOCK PEOPLE FROM ENTERING THE REHEARSAL ROOM.

BETH

(HUGGING BILLY) Congratulations. (TO

ANNA) Welcome to the family.

(MORE)

BETH (CONT'D)

So, you're from Brooklyn? I house sat

in Park Slope for a while. Represent!

BILLY

Beth!

BETH

Sorry.

BILLY

Anna, to answer your question, of course I want to be in Ida's life. Absolutely. One hundred percent.

ANNA

I'm so glad. But, right now-- Your

bride isn't taking this well.

HE TURNS TO SEE JUNE SCREAMING AT HIM LIKE A LUNATIC.

BILLY

Oh, no, June. (THROUGH THE GLASS) This

all happened before we even met!

AS JUNE EXITS THE BUILDING SHE RIPS DOWN DECORATIONS.

ANNA

Billy, you should go after her.

BILLY

I'll be back!

BILLY EXITS, BETH CALLS OUT...

BETH

I feel awful about the "your life is a

fairy tale" comment.

ANNA LOOKS OUT OVER THE CHAOS.

ANNA

Oh, my God. Have I made a big mistake, moving Ida and me here?

BETH

No, no, Anna. You haven't. I know it might seem like this place is just football, guns, BBQ and God. But, its not. It's football, guns, BBQ, God and so much love. Yes, Texans have big opinions, because they have such big hearts.

ANNA

(PLAYFUL) Are you reading that off a poster somewhere?

BETH

I just want you to know this is a great place to raise a little girl. They may look like a bunch of lunatics, right now, but I promise you these are real good people.

CUT TO:

INT. MUSIC STORE - CONTINUOUS

THE WHOLE ROOM IS ARGUING. BEAU AND DOCTOR SQUARE OFF AGAINST SOME BAPTISTS, ABOUT TO FIGHT. JAMES STANDS ON A CHAIR.

JAMES

Everyone, let's calm down!

GLORIA

James, honey, your heart.

JAMES

This is a stressful situation, but

remember, we're all friends here.

Please!

AS HIS HEART-RATE CLIMBS, JAMES' SMARTWATCH STARTS PLAYING "DEEP IN THE HEART OF TEXAS." AT THE CHORUS, THE WHOLE ROOM STOPS ON A DIME TO "CLAP-CLAP-CLAP-CLAP!"

EVERYONE

DEEP IN THE HEART OF TEXAS!

AS THE SONG CONTINUES, SO DOES THE ARGUING.

MAYOR

James, your son has ruined my entire

"values" campaign platform.

EVERYONE, "CLAP-CLAP-CLAP-CLAP"

EVERYONE

DEEP IN THE HEART OF TEXAS!

FLOYD

Oh, yeah, well I'm starting to think

traditional values are the myth and

global warming is real.

EVERYONE, "CLAP-CLAP-CLAP-CLAP."

BLACK OUT.

SCENE K

INT. LIVING ROOM - DAY

GLORIA CHANGES OUT PHOTOS ON THE WALL WITH PHOTOS OF IDA AND ANNA. MAYBE TOO MANY. BETH AND LIZ HELP.

BETH

Mom, its a bit of overkill.

GLORIA

There is a lot of white on this wall, I want Anna and Ida to feel welcomed when they get here. (TEARY) I hope the baby likes me.

BETH

She's gonna love you.

LIZ

Billy says Ida is a giggler. Nothing better than a baby laugh. Makes me want just one more. (THEN, SCREAMING) Dallas, don't touch that cake!

BETH

I'm just glad I'm here to show Anna the ropes. Like how people say they're "getting their ducks in a row" but no one owns ducks. It can be confusing.

LIZ

So, now that June called off the wedding, are Billy and Anna a couple? THE LADIES HUDDLE AND GOSSIP LIKE HENS.

BETH

He says they don't feel that way about

each other. That they're "brothers."

LIZ

Who had a baby together? Ew.

BETH

But my bedroom is next to his. I hear

them on the phone. (OFF HOPEFUL LOOKS)

It's very flirty.

ON THE OTHER SIDE OF THE ROOM WE FIND JAMES, BEAU AND BILLY. HANDS IN POCKETS. AFTER A LONG SILENCE...

BILLY

What kind of motor was in that old

Cutlass you had?

JAMES

A 350 rocket. (THEN, AWKWARD) While

we're being all open and honest like

this... (CALLING OUT THE LADIES OVER)

there's something your mother and I

need to share with you.

THE LADIES CROSS OVER, GLORIA KNOWS WHAT THIS IS ABOUT.

JAMES (CONT'D)

Despite what you kids might think, our

relationship isn't perfect.

GLORIA

No, it's not. I'm not proud of this, but a few years ago, I was smitten by another man. I confessed to your Dad--

JAMES

And, because I was hurt, I took up

with another woman.

BILLY

Are you serious?

GLORIA

Thankfully, with love and forgiveness

we found our way back to each other.

JAMES

Point is. No relationship is perfect,

so go easy on yourselves.

THE KIDS LET THIS SOAK IN A BEAT. THEN...

BETH

Wait. Are you two talking about that summer Mom watched Brad Burly on channel nine evening news and Dad

watched Linda Sanders on channel five?

THE DOORBELL RINGS.

GLORIA

The baby is here!

BILLY

I'll get it. Calm down everyone.

BILLY OPENS THE DOOR. IT'S JUNE, LOOKING NOT SO BUBBLY.

BILLY (CONT'D)

June.

EVERYONE AD-LIBS SURPRISED GREETINGS.

JUNE

Sorry I've been avoiding you.

BILLY

It's okay. I understand.

JUNE SLAPS HIM. EVERYONE GASPS. BUT NO ONE MOVES.

JUNE

I've prayed about it. And...

SHE KISSES HIM.

JUNE (CONT'D)

I want to call the wedding back on.

THERE'S AN ODD BEAT - EVERYONE IS WIDE-EYED, WAITING.

BILLY

You do? That's... great.

JUNE

For next year. So I can re-plan.

BILLY AND JUNE HUG AND KISS. JUNE'S NOT LETTING GO. EVERYONE CLAPS, SORT OF, NOT SURE IF THIS IS GOOD OR NOT.

ANNA AND THE BABY PEEK IN THE DOORWAY BEHIND THEM.

ANNA

(MOUTHS) Is this a bad time?

THE WHOLE FAMILY EXCITEDLY, BUT QUIETLY, REACTS TO SEEING IDA FOR THE FIRST TIME. THEY WAVE ANNA INSIDE. ANNA SLIPS PAST BILLY AND JUNE, STILL MAKING UP. THE FAMILY RUSHES TO IDA.

GLORIA

(WHISPERING) Give me that baby!

GLORIA TAKES IDA AND SMOTHERS HER IN KISSES. EVERYONE IS IN TEARS AT THE SIGHT OF THIS ADORABLE NEW MEMBER OF THE FAMILY. THE SCENE IS WHAT YOU'D EXPECT OF A FAMILY RECEIVING A NEW BABY - COMMENTS ABOUT WHO SHE LOOKS LIKE, HOW BIG SHE IS, PEOPLE TRYING TO MAKE HER SMILE - BUT IT'S ALL PANTOMIMED.

BILLY FINALLY NOTICES.

BILLY

Anna!

ANNA

(AWKWARD) Heeeey.

JUNE

Oh. Hi. They're here. I should go.

ANNA

Or we can go.

EVERYONE

No!

BILLY

Can't you both stay?

JUNE

In my heart, God is telling me it's

best if we don't rush this.

JUST THEN, TORNADO SIRENS START TO ROAR.

CUT TO:

INT. TORNADO SHELTER - LATER

EVERYONE IS AWKWARDLY PACKED INSIDE.

JAMES

Want me to take a picture?

BILLY

No.

FADE OUT.

*

END OF SHOW
